

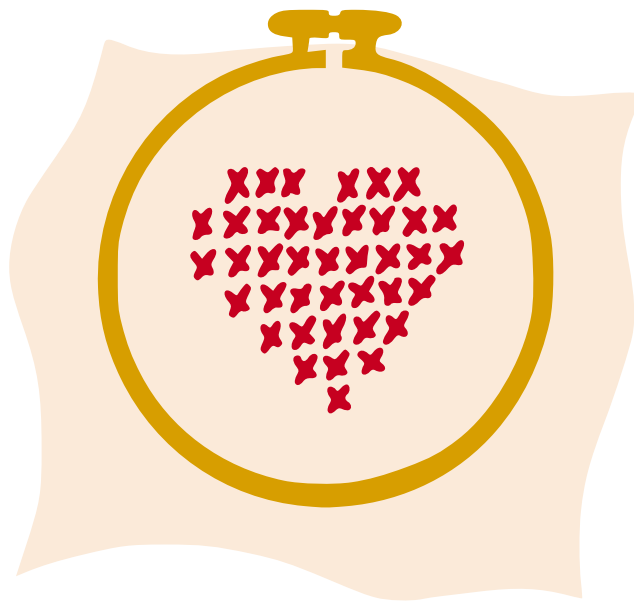
Grid Lines

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Grid Lines are used in sewing to help the stitcher follow a pattern. It is used in cross stitch.

Gridding makes the fabric look similar to the pattern chart and helps when counting to find where to place your stitches. The fabric is divided into 10 stitch x 10 stitch sections.

There is two ways to do this: either draw the grid onto the fabric with a water soluble pen; or sbaste titch lines to mark the sections.



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
