Grid Lines



Grid Lines are used in sewing to help the stitcher follow a pattern. It is used in cross stitch. Gridding makes the fabric look similar to the pattern chart and helps when counting to find where to place your stitches. The fabric is divided into $10 \text{ stitch } \times 10 \text{ stitch sections}$.

There is two ways to do this: either draw the grid onto the fabric with a water soluble pen; or sbaste titch lines to mark the sections.
