SESTINA CLEVELAND is a vocal ensemble specializing in early seventeenth-century madrigals and sacred music. Recent projects have included performances with Choral Arts Cleveland and recording sessions focusing on women composers. A flexible ensemble, Sestina Cleveland adapts to meet the needs of the repertoire. Artistic director Anna O'Connell, DMA often leads from the harp.

ERIC CHARNOFSKY enjoys a multi-faceted career as a pianist, composer, lecturer, conductor, and narrator. As a collaborative pianist, he has performed throughout North America with members of major American orchestras, and as an orchestral keyboardist with the Los Angeles Philharmonic and the Cleveland Orchestra, among others. A graduate of The Juilliard School where he majored in piano accompanying, Mr. Charnofsky also holds degrees in solo piano performance and composition from California State University, Northridge.

He is active in musical arts administration, serving on boards for the Cleveland Chamber Music Society and Chamber Music Society of Ohio. He has also narrated with the Cleveland Orchestra and other ensembles. Mr. Charnofsky's compositions have been performed in several major U.S. cities, and he has received composition commissions from Pacific Serenades, the Chamber Music Society of Ohio, the Cleveland Chamber Collective, Ohio Music Teachers Association, and others.

Flutist KALEB CHESNIC delights audiences with his commanding presence, brilliant technique, and thoughtful interpretations. Chesnic is an active solo, chamber, and orchestral musician, having performed with The Cleveland Orchestra, Colorado Symphony, Albany Symphony Orchestra, and other groups around the USA. Chesnic is Lecturer in Flute at Baldwin Wallace University's Conservatory of Performing Arts.

MAGGIE JOHNS is in the first year of her Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Piano Performance at the Cleveland Institute of Music. Previously studying with Dr. Larissa Dedova, Maggie graduated summa cum laude and Presser Scholar with her B.M. in Piano Performance from the University of Maryland. While pursuing degrees in solo piano, her career as a collaborative pianist has taken her through New York, Florida, the District of Columbia, and beyond. Maggie recently won 2nd prize in the 2023 American Virtuoso International Music Competition as well as 2nd Prize in the 1st International Music Competition in 2022.

NATHAN HILL is in the 11th grade at St. Edward High School in Lakewood. He has performed in the OMEA Junior Festival at Baldwin-Wallace Conservatory for the past five years, accumulating top ratings and earning him two gold cups for the Piano Solo event. He has been playing the piano for over ten years and plans to make a career of it. He has been looking at conservatories such as Juilliard, Indiana University, Oberlin and Northwestern. Mr. Hill is a student of Coren Estrin Mino.

Composers—Music—Texts—Translations

INNA ONOFREI (Saakova) is an Armenian-American composer and educator living in the Cleveland area. Her catalogue includes music for piano, choir, chamber ensembles, orchestra, voice, solo instruments, as well as electronic and electro-acoustic works. Onofrei's music has been performed in Russia, the United States of America, Belgium and Greece. One of Onofrei's compositions, written in 1997 about her hometown, Nevinnomyssk, was adopted as the town's anthem.

Onofrei holds a bachelors degree in music theory and composition from Stavropol State College of Arts and masters degrees in piano performance and composition from Cleveland State University. She currently works as a freelance composer and arranger, as well as an educator at Musicologie Cleveland Heights.

AURA (2019) was one of the first pieces I composed after enduring two years of debilitating chronic migraines. During that time, I was unable to practice piano, listen to music, or create anything new. This piece is a deeply personal reflection of that experience—an expression of the emotions, thoughts, and daily struggles I faced while living with constant pain

A native Clevelander, NICHOLAS PUIN holds a Bachelor's of Music Composition Degree from The Berklee College of Music, a Master's of Music Composition Degree and an Ohio Teaching Certificate from Cleveland State University. His compositions and arrangements have been performed by members of The Cleveland Orchestra, The Cleveland Chamber Symphony, The Cleveland Jazz Orchestra, The Singing Angels, The Bop Stop Jazz Unit and most recently the Baldwin Wallace University and the Case Western University Jazz Ensembles.

ANOTHER CHANCE is largely in the key of Eb Major. During the thirteen-bar introduction, tonalities related to this key are heard in similar rhythms. At bar 14, Theme 1 is now stated for eight bars. Following this, a transition consisting of arpeggiated descending diminished chords leads the piece to a nine-bar development of the Theme. Another section of descending diminished chords is now heard followed by Theme II but now in the key of D Major. A short development of Theme II follows, including another transition to a da capo and coda ending the work.

Scored for flute and four-part mixed chorus, **THE PEACE WITHIN** employs no text beyond a statement of the title. Instead, the sounds "Aw, "Ooo" and "Ah" are sung throughout the work as it moves through different time signatures and key areas.

A native of Rome, Italy, **Dr. Lorenzo Salvagni** is a well-established composer, pianist, organist, translator and language instructor. He is Director of Music at Holy Rosary Church in Little Italy, Lecturer of Italian at John Carroll University, and Staff Pianist at Hathaway Brown School in Shaker Heights. Dr. Salvagni's compositions are frequently performed, recorded and broadcast nationally and internationally, and are currently available on all major streaming services. Dr. Salvagni is the current chairman of the Cleveland Composers Guild.

He holds a bachelors degree in music history from the University of Michiganand a master's degree in composition from Cleveland State University. He retired in 2020 after twenty-two years as assistant music librarian at Case Western Reserve University, and directs the Gregorian Schola at St. Mary Parish, Akron OH. His sacred music has been performed in such varied venues as the National Shrine in Washington, DC, San Francisco's Mission Dolores, and Vienna's Stephansdom. He llives in Windham, Ohio, on six acres with his wife Rusty and assorted livestock.

GEOFFREY PETERSON's music has been performed throughout the United States, Canada, and Europe. The CLEVELAND COMPOSERS GUILD is one of the nation's oldest new music organizations, and has had over 200 composer members over its 67-year history. There are currently about 40 professional composers in the Guild whose work represents a wide range of musical styles. In recent years the Guild has collaborated with Sestina Cleveland, the Poiesis Quartet, the American Guild of Organists, the North Coast Winds, Factory Seconds Brass Trio, Cleveland Chamber Symphony, Burning River Baroque, the Cleveland Jazz Orchestra, the Cleveland Chamber Choir, and with various local solo artists, to create multi-disciplinary concerts that engage with the arts in a new way. The CCG produces numerous live concerts every season featuring the finest performers available in Northeast Ohio. In addition to regular series programs, the Guild produces an annual *Creativity: Learning Through Experience* concert in tandem with the Music Settlement in University Circle and recognizes young undergraduate composers in Northeast Ohio through its Collegiate Composition Contest.
