1. What is your background?

I believe that party affiliation doesn't belong on school board seats, as education should remain a nonpartisan issue. Additionally, I support term limits for school board members, with a maximum of three 4-year terms to ensure fresh perspectives and accountability.

6. What strategies or recommendations do you have for how the Polk County School Board and the Lake Wales Charter School system could work together more effectively to ensure all families and facilities in Lake Wales are better supported?

I am advocate for school choice. I believe choice creates competition and forces lower performing schools to improve. The Polk County School Board should view the Lake Wales Charter School system as an ally. Open communication between the administrations is necessary for the success of both.

Marcus Wright Jr.



I recommend establishing an annual joint board meeting between the Polk County School Board and the Lake Wales Charter School system. This meeting would allow both boards to discuss shared concerns and collaborate on solutions while also providing a platform to hear and address the needs of the community effectively.
