

Season: November–May

Anchor Ports: Nassau, Cozumel, Belize City

Highlights: Shark diving, cenotes, great visibility

E. Pacific Giants (2029)

Key Dive Sites: Wolf & Darwin (Galápagos), Cocos Island

Season: June–December

Anchor Ports: Puerto Ayora, Puntarenas

Highlights: Hammerheads, whale sharks, remote pelagic aggregations

F. French Polynesia Finale (2030)

Key Dive Sites: Fakarava, Rangiroa, Tikehau


Season: May–October

Anchor Ports: Tahiti, Bora Bora

Highlights: Shark walls, dolphins, soft corals
