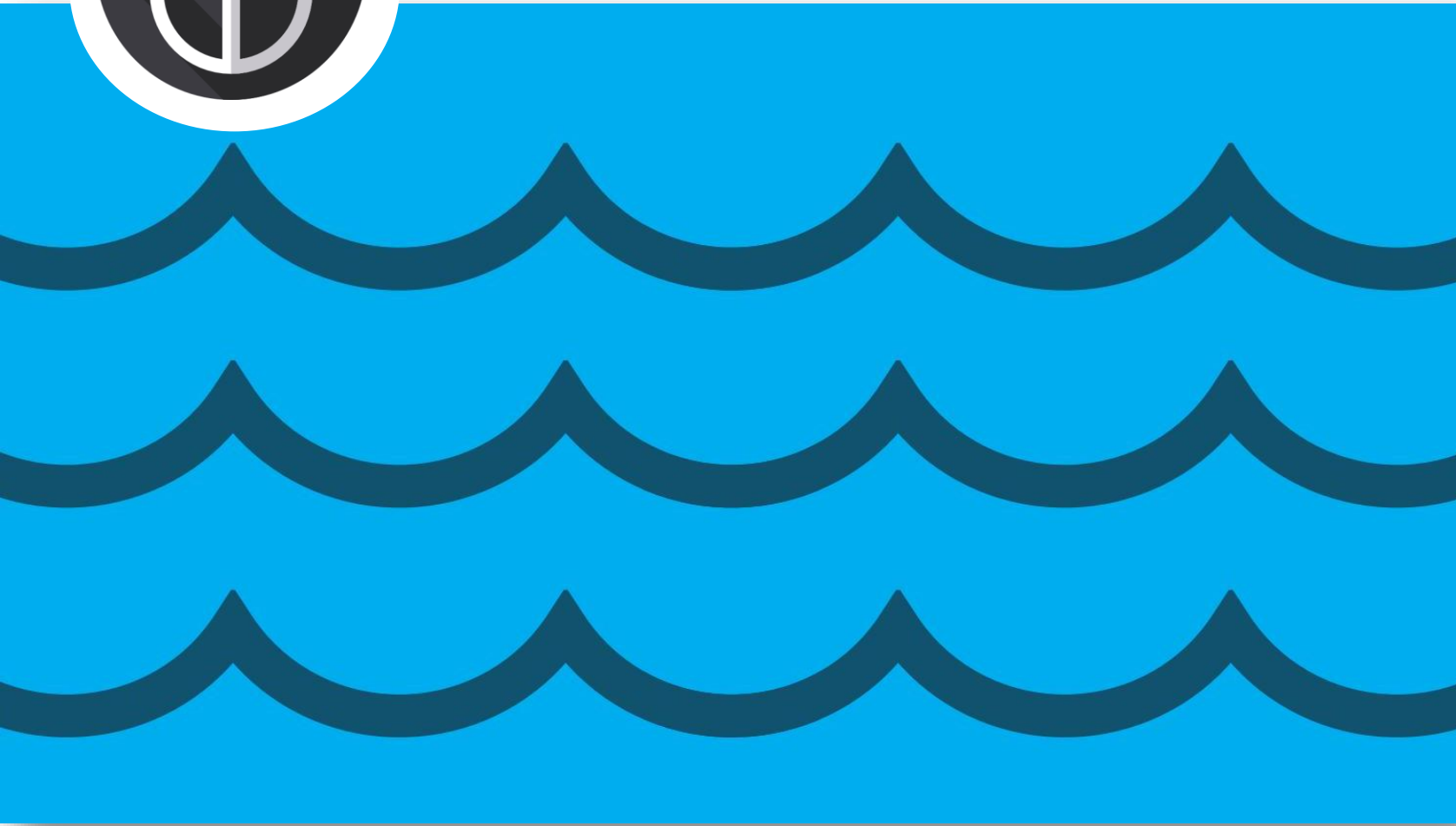

Marina Rating Standards for Super and Mega Yachts



There are different criteria and methods for rating marinas that cater to super and mega yachts, which are generally defined as yachts over 24 meters or 79 feet in length.

Berth Facilities

c. Fire Safety:

Fire prevention and suppression systems compliant with international standards, with readily available firefighting equipment.





Amenities and Services

a. Concierge Services:

Dedicated concierge services to assist with guest needs, provisions, and coordination of services to assist with provisioning, transportation and local arrangements.

b. Crew Facilities:

Facilities and services catering to the comfort and needs of the yacht crew, including crew lounges, recreation areas, and crew transportation.

c. High-Speed Internet and Connectivity:

Reliable high-speed internet and communication services to meet the connectivity needs of guests and crew.

d. High-quality amenities: The marina should offer a range of amenities catering to the specific needs of super and mega yachts, including:

- Dedicated crew facilities with showers, laundry, and relaxation areas.
- Waste disposal and recycling facilities for various types of waste generated on board.
- On-site fuel bunkering services with high-quality fuel and efficient delivery.
- Medical assistance and emergency services readily available.

e. Maintenance and repair services: The marina should provide access to qualified technicians and workshops equipped to handle the maintenance and repair needs of super and mega yachts, including electrical, mechanical, and hull work.

- Guest services: The marina should offer facilities and services for guests, including:
 - Luxury restaurants and bars.
 - Swimming pools and fitness centers.
 - Entertainment and leisure activities.
 - Shopping and retail options.
 - Transportation services to nearby destinations.



Environmental Responsibility



a. Waste Management:

- Efficient waste management systems, including recycling facilities, to minimize the environmental impact.

Preparation and Arrival
