



2023 William D. Boker, Thanksgiving Basket Program

This year, under the always stellar planning and guidance of our SD Jeffrey Greenwald, the Lodge was able to build and deliver over 160 baskets and pre-made meals during the morning of November 19th. Starting at 7:00 AM, the lodge with the help of M & M Appliances Box Truck, picked up the groceries at the Kensington Safeway and delivered them to the Brethren and Families in the Kensington Masonic Lodge parking lot. Each basket contained a Turkey or Turkey breast, (Kosher if requested), 3lb bag of apples, a bag of carrots, celery, 3lbs of yellow onions, 5lbs of white potatoes, cranberry sauce, canned yams, vegetable bouillon, stuffing, a loaf of bread and pumpkin bread from the Sunflower Bakery.

The baskets were quickly assembled and drivers for JSSA, Bnai Tzedek Sisterhood, and The Eagle School in Washington D.C. picked them up for distribution to the needy families of their organizations. Once all the baskets were picked up, pre-made meals from Costco were picked up and staged for another set of drivers who delivered the meals.

There are many stories about our brethren during the Civil War, although they were wearing different color uniforms, not taking up arms against each other.

One of the more famous encounters is memorialized by a large bronze and stone memorial at the Gettysburg, PA Cemetery called the Friend to Friend Masonic Memorial.

The Friend-to-Friend Masonic Memorial was originally commissioned by the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania and was finished and dedicated as a memorial to the Freemasons of the Union and the Confederacy in the National Cemetery Annex on August 21, 1993.

Many years ago, one of the younger Keilsohn's Delaware Lodge brothers suggested visiting the memorial. So on a rainy and cold Veteran's Day, both Brother Keilsohns set off on a field trip to visit Gettysburg.

The Friend-to-Friend Monument depicts Brother Confederate Brigadier General Lewis A. Armistead, wounded after crossing the wall during the climax of Pickett's Charge on July 3, 1863, being attended to by Brother Union Captain Henry H. Bingham.

The story that goes with the encounter between Brethren Armistead and Bingham is best described by the bronze plaque on the memorial.



After visiting the memorial and taking the expected pictures. The Keilsohn's then walked around the rest of the cemetery which is the final resting place of so many soldiers and veterans.

Next, the Keilsohn's headed to the Gettysburg Battlefield visitor's center to learn more about the bloodiest battle of the Civil War. And to dry out some. The visitor's center and museum walk the visitor through the three days of the Battle of Gettysburg. The museum then ends with a section about President Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address at the dedication of the cemetery several months after the battle.

Some trivia about the Gettysburg Address. President Lincoln was not the keynote speaker for the dedication of the Gettysburg Cemetery. Hon. Edward Everett delivered a two-hour oration before President Lincoln's short remarks. The 271 words (ten sentences) of his Gettysburg Address took him only a few minutes to deliver.

Something to think about. Maybe Lincoln was wrong? At about the middle of his address "The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, ...". Lincoln's Gettysburg address is his most famous oration. Many argue that it is one of the most important in the history of the United States.
