



"In June, we mark 75 years since the start of what General Dwight D. Eisenhower called the Great Crusade – the Allied liberation of Europe in World War II. On D-Day, June 6, 1944, 15,000 young American men jumped from the sky, and 60,000 more stormed in from the sea, to save our civi-

What is the N Street Village?

While this was the second year that the Lodge volunteered to help the N Street Village, most of us may not be familiar with the important mission that it has. One of the leaders of this organization addressed the volunteers to explain.

"We help women achieve stability and make meaningful gains in their housing, income, employment, mental health, physical health, and addiction recovery. Every day at least one woman comes to N Street Village for the first time, and I know that – but for a few circumstances of fortune and timing – 'she' could be me."

N Street Village serves nearly

2,000 homeless and low-income women each year.

We recognize that those we serve face a variety of challenges, and some individuals may face numerous obstacles simultaneously. Some of the most common challenges for the women of N Street Village include: health or mental health problems, substance abuse or addiction, a history of trauma, a lack of educational and vocational opportunities, job loss or eviction, domestic violence, a criminal background or other barriers to employment, or functional illiteracy. And sometimes the biggest challenge for a woman arriving at our front door is the loss of her own sense of dignity, self-worth, and hope.

- 1 in 2 have no income when they arrive
- 57% are 50 years or older
- 64% self-reported having a disability including physical, mental, developmental, addition or a combination
- 8% self-reported living with HIV/AIDS
- · 80% are African American

N Street Village serves nearly 2,000 homeless and low-income women each year. We are the largest provider of housing and services for women in D.C. experiencing homelessness.



By-Law Change to BE VOTED ON AT MARCH STATED

Currently Section 1 A. reads

SECTION 1 - STATED COMMUNICATIONS

A. The Stated Communication of this Lodge shall be held on the Second Tuesday of each month at 7:30 p.m., during the months of September through June, except in December, when the stated communication shall be held on the Second Sunday at 1:00 p.m.

Change "June" to read "July."

Section 1 A. will then read:

SECTION 1 - STATED COMMUNICATIONS

A. The Stated Communication of this Lodge shall be held on the Second Tuesday of each month at 7:30 p.m., during the months of September through July, except in December, when the stated communication shall be held on the Second Sunday at 1:00 p.m.

Rationale: Occasionally, our September Stated Communication will fall on a religious holiday requiring us to call off the Stated. That would violate the Grand Lodge Code by not meeting at least once during the quarter. Under these circumstances, we could meet in July and thus meet during that quarter. If not needed, the Lodge could vote to call off the July Stated. Our rent is paid for both July and August so we wouldn't be expending any additional to hold a July meeting.
