Wreath Laying at the WWII Memorial Commemorating the D-Day Invasion

Universal **Brotherhood** Celebration (UBC) was inaugurated this year on Friday morning, June 7th, 2019, with a solemn ceremony honoring the 75th anniversary of the D-Day Invasion of Europe in World War II. Our Grand Master, Charbel T. Fahed presided over assembled brethren from across the jurisdiction and distinguished Masonic visitors from around the United States and the world at the National WWII Memorial on the National Mall. Joining him was U.S. Senator Chris Van Hollen and U.S. Congressman Jamie Raskin, both from Maryland.

Together, they in turn, laid wreaths to honor two World War II veterans their jurisdictions. which, The Grand Master and the Senator along with our WM Robert Greenwald, JW Burt Levey and PM Michael Greenwald personally honored Bro. Herman Zeitchik (U.S. Army and S. Gompers-B. Franklin Lodge No. 45) and WBro. Jerrold Gordon (U.S. Navy and Past Master of S. Gompers-B. Franklin Lodge No. 45) for their service in the Atlantic and Pacific Theatres respectively Freemasonry's Medal Honor. A number of wreaths were presented by the visiting dignitaries.

An invocation was then offered in multiple languages in keeping with the Universal Brotherhood Celebration. Following the presentation, the officers spoke with Congressman Jamie Raskin about our Lodge Namesake Samuel Gompers.
