### Notice of Intent to Serve Elected Office Secretary Must Have Letter by November 7th

Any Brother wishing to have his name announced as desirous of being considered for an elected office in Samuel Gompers-Benjamin Franklin Lodge No. 45 F.A.A.M. for the 2020 Masonic year may submit a letter to this effect indicating the office in which he wishes to serve. No Brother may serve as Master of the Lodge unless he has served at least one year as a Warden and meets the other requirements stated in the Grand Lodge Code. Letters should be submitted to the Secretary by November 7th for them to be read during our Elections Night and have their name appear on the election ballot.

Incumbent elected officers do not need to submit letters expressing their intention to move up in the officer line or be re-elected in their current position (for non-progressive office). An elected officer, not wishing to move up or serve again in a non-progressive office, should so notify the Secretary by November 7th and this information will also be announced on Election Night.

On Election Night, the Secretary will read the names of all eligible members who have expressed an interest in seeking elected positions and those officers not seeking re-election or election to the next higher office, if any, and their names may also be printed on the ballot as interested in that office. There is NO requirement to submit a letter to be elected to any office as a member may vote for any member in good standing for any elected office. The submission of a letter in this manner shall not be construed to be a mandatory prerequisite for election to office.

## In The West

Brethren, first some updates. I have had the pleasure of attending a few more Warden's nights. It is interesting, that with 40 plus Lodges in DC, Warden's night at some Lodges only had two visitors #45 and maybe two other visitors. Recently we attended Warden's Night at Federal Lodge #1. Besides Warden's night, they hosted a wonderful Festive Board. There were about 150 brethren and it was a great night. Truly one of the things that Masonry is all about.

When is Warden's night at #45? As happens every few years, the Jewish holidays stepped (more like it slammed) our schedule again this year. Warden's night would have probably been the canceled October meeting, which ended up on Erev Yom Kippur. The next Warden's night will be October 2020 and will include a Festive Board as well. More on next year's schedule in next month's Bulletin.

Discussing Federal Lodge #1, they did a courtesy Fellowcrafts degree for two of our Brethren. But this was unlike any Fellowcrafts degree I have ever been to. There were 15, yes you read that correctly, 15 Brethren passed to the degree of Fellocrafts. Federal meets at the Odd Fellows Hall, and the lodge room is a bit smaller than the one at Takoma Masonic Center. So getting 15 candidates, their 15 conductors, and the rest of the supporting cast, 35 plus people, all in the right spots for the degree was amazing. For me, being able to participate in the degree as a conductor, was even more amazing.

While on the subject of Degrees, put November 12th on your calendar for our Master Mason Degree. The cast has been working hard, so it is going to be an outstanding degree.

I recently attended the Grand Lodge's, 2019 Masonic Day of Thanksgiving & Remembrance. This year it was held at The George Washington Masonic National Memorial. An interesting building, and worth the visit if you have never been. Since this was a Friday evening, the logistics for me getting there was an adventure. After a 45-minute car ride from work to the Glenmont Metro Station, I work just east of Columbia, I took the Red Line to Gallery Place. Then changed trains to the Yellow line, got off at the King Street station, and then I had a 20-minute walk up the hill to the building. Fortunately, there are lots of walkways with several hundred steps to get from the bottom to the top of the hill which the Memorial sits on.

The featured speaker for the evening was Melanie Kirkpatrick. Her talk was titled "Thanksgiving: the Holiday at the Heart of the American Experience." It had never really occurred to me that Thanksgiving, complete with Turkey is an American (as in the United States) holiday. Just like the 4th of July. Several other countries celebrate Thanksgiving, but the premise for the holiday is not a feast with the locals. She drew a wonderful timeline describing the history of the holiday, from the Pilgrims to modern times. And she managed to stitch in how some of our Masonic Brethren influenced the holiday. Including one who tried to change the date from the last Thursday of the month to the week before, because in 1939, there were five Thursdays in the month, which significantly shortened the number of shopping days between Thanksgiving and Christmas.
