Howard was raised in Samuel Gompers Lodge when they met at Congregation Tifereth Israel in Washington D.C.. The night he was raised there were so many Brethren in attendance that it was standing room only in the large room. He remembered that Ted Kahn gave the Charge when he was initiated. Brother Chester Katz, recognized for 40 years of service was also in attendance and two Brothers, Maurice Berger and William A. Stein, recognized for 55 years of service sent photographs.

GrandView is our membership database. It utilizes an online interface, and is accessed by all members within the jurisdiction of Washington, DC. It is vitally important that you keep your contact information up to date and accurate, so that important information from the Grand Lodge and your constituent Lodge can be communicated to you according to your preferences.

Please Note: We <u>do not</u> share <u>any</u> of your information with outside or third party sources – **EVER**.
