

We altered our plans somewhat as we usually put together the baskets early on the Sunday morning before Thanksgiving, just prior to distribution to the JSSA drivers who deliver them. Accomplishing this on Saturday evening turned

out to be much more efficient as we simply used the covered back parking lot at the Kensington Safeway, where we set up tables and used an assembly line to eventually load the baskets onto the truck. The Safeway workers were very accommodating in bringing the purchased goods to us and we accomplished everything in less than 90 minutes.

Thank you to Kensington-Bethesda lodge # 198 and Bro Steven Stumpp who came out early to open up the Lodge and make sure we had everything we needed.










## November Meeting Celebrated Veterans Day and a Great Game of Masonic Jeopardy

At our November Stated Communication, the WM led a discussion on Veterans Day and asked each of the veterans present to talk briefly about their service. The WM thanked all Veterans for their service to the country. Our Fidelity Medal Recipient Jerrold Gordon, PM started these remembrances of his service in the U.S. Army during WWII. SW Jeff Greenwald served for his career in the U.S. Navy Medical Service. Robert Greenwald, PM served in the U.S. Marines during multiple tours in Vietnam and Cambodia. Chaplain Walter F. Simon, PM served in the U.S. Army in the mid-1950s in Germany and traveled widely in Europe. SW Burt Levy served in the U.S. Army Medical Corps and was stationed stateside. MC Sheldon I. Rappeport served in the U.S. Army in the Finance Corps and SS Aaron Kamerer served in the U.S. Marines as a TOW Gunner. Bro. Kamerer has two sons who are now serving, one in the U.S. Navy and one who just entered the U.S. Marines.

Following our vote, WM Jerry Keilsohn hosted an energetic and cleverly designed game of Masonic Jeopardy which made for a fun and engaging meeting.
