The two of us did most of the work with a few JSSA volunteers contributing. Our Treasurer, Most Worshipful Bob Starr, PGM came towards the end to cheer us on. Our Tiler, Hal Henig also came towards the end but graciously agreed to deliver 5 bags that were otherwise unaccounted for.

As we were finishing up, it was apparent that we were missing about 30 bags that normally would have been delivered up-county by members of Kehilat Shalom Synagogue. Over the past several years JD Greenwald was involved in bringing those bags to Kehilat Shalom, but unfortunately, he had to deliver the bad news instead, that the bags were not to be found. Lo and behold, however, about 2 hours later, the bags were found in a small room adjacent to the equipment room at the Hebrew Academy, so brother Greenwald returned and picked them up. Fortunately, the members of Kehilat Shalom re-grouped and eventually delivered the bags. WM Keilsohn also delivered 2 bags to the remote areas of Ft. Washington and Bowie.

RSVP is an initialism derived from the French phrase Répondez s'il vous plaît, literally meaning "Respond, If-You-Please", or just "Please Respond", to require confirmation of an invitation.

Before every communication, the secretary sends out multiple invitations, including an eVite. Less than half of the brethren reply. During the last several months, there have been a growing number of brethren that reply that they will attend and then do not. This is costing the Lodge money.

Why you ask? Prior to each meeting, whoever volunteers to coordinate the meal before the meeting, uses the number of Yes responses to figure out how much food is needed to make sure there is a meal for everybody that attends. All the Jewish mothers in my family would come back and haunt me if there was not enough food for everybody who attended.

But we are having the opposite problem. Which is getting expensive and causing a terrible waste of food. Recently, we had a confirmed count of 28 attending. We had 20, and one of them was a surprise visitor. This means that nearly a third of those who promised to attend failed to notify us of their change of plans.

Dinner is expensive! And not getting any cheaper. Even something as simple as Pizza costs more than \$10 a person. A full meal costs two to three times that. When a third of the brethren who confirmed that they would attend do not, that cost per person goes up 50%.
