My mother did everything in her power to bring us to church through my older brother Pastor Wesley, the one who introduced me to Christ for my salvation and baptized me.

I am now a worship leader in Path to Salvation Church and I also play drums.

What has it been like living in Titanyen these last couple years? Living (in) Titanyen during this time is something that requires a lot of wisdom and it seems like something risky because there's no presence of the police, there's no portable water, electricity, and many other things. We just living by faith.

So, I do that to everyone by preaching about the love of God (John 3.16) and God's punishment too because the reward of sin is death (Rom 6.23). The situation is very difficult but I stand on God's promise because he is not man to lies. The Bible says, if God is for us what can be against us (Rom 8:31). That's why , I only count on God's protection for my family and for my church.
