Thank you to those who attended our Active Shooter Training on May 24, 2025, immediately following chapter meeting. There were a few follow-up questions, items the committee will address and update the chapter at a later date.

Key takeaways From the Session:

Good practices for coping with an active shooter situation, according to Chief Martin, include:

- Being aware of your environment for any possible danger.
- Take note of the two nearest exits in any facility.
- Staying inside an office and securing the door.
- Finding a room in the hallways.
- Run, Hide, Fight
- As a last resort, take the active shooter down. When the shooter is at close range and you cannot flee, your chance of survival is much greater if you try to incapacitate him/her.
- Call 911 when it's safe to do so
