On Saturday, April 4th Enhance Our Environment partnered with the villages of Homewood and Flossmoor to participate in their Community Clean Up. The event began with breakfast at Wiley's Grill at the Coyote Run golf course in Flossmoor. Theta Rho Omega turned out in great numbers to participate. Even though the event rained out, the breakfast was a great time for sisterly relations and meeting members of the park district and community. The event will be rescheduled and TRO is committed to participating again. At CRC members of TRO enthusiastically participated in the regional service project to pack maternal care kits. Every form of social media or internet platform affects our sorority's reputation. In a 24/7 news cycle, it takes but a few minutes for the sorority's brand to be tarnished.

Membership Experience Availability

There will be a zoom meeting of the Rituals Committee on Wednesday, April 29, 2026, at 6:30 P.M. The invitation has already been sent to the 2025 Rituals Team.

Membership Experience requires set up, preparation and inventory management from the Rituals committee and we need to be aware of dates and personal availability.

Rituals Workshop Central Region Convention

I attended the Rituals Workshop on Saturday April 11, 2026, at the CRC. The workshop was facilitated by Soror Markea Haywood from Team Ready. It was informative and enjoyable.

Points To Share:

- Chapters present had budgets for Rituals ranging from \$100 and up depending on chapter size. Uses included storing, replacing, cleaning items, printing and copying.
- Graduate Rituals Chairman should have access to the Rituals.
- The Chapter Basileus should purchase two copies of the current Rituals, One for the Basileus and one for the Chairman to use. For undergraduate chapters the Graduate Advisor may keep rituals and materials.
- All Chapters should have in their collection a Standing Shield.
- Chapters should practice the pledge, and National Hymn annually to review the words.
- Ritual White Attire was discussed at length. Attire is uninterrupted white dress or suit, closed toe shoes with heels, no mules. Small peep toe, or sling back is acceptable. No embellishments. Jewelry should be a single strand of pearls.
- The events which require ritual white are Ivy Beyond the Wall, Chapter Chartering and Membership Experience. Sorors should wear ritual white where white is indicated.

- Several role plays were acted out which showed the responsibilities of the Philacters at the door.
- Ritual Attire is stated and defined by manual. The Protocol Chairman, Epistoleus and Basileus, will communicate oral reminders to the chapter at meetings and through written correspondence such as newsletter and invitation, what the event attire is. Business attire is conservative. Best Practice is what you would wear to an interview or an office job.
- The **Philacter's** committee is responsible for enforcement of entry. Entry may be denied if the soror does not have the proper credentials. Entry may be denied if Sorors are tardy. Entry may be denied if Sorors are not dressed in the proper attire.
- Some Chapter **Philacters** keep white shawls and flexible white ritual slip- on shoes at the door. They may ask the soror to put large jewelry in a purse.
- They may hold a purse if it is not white. Rationale, some Soror Guests may be elderly or have been inactive for some time who are coming to celebrate their loved ones. These practices are **optional**.
- Chapter Officers, and Ritual Chairman are NOT responsible for enforcement of compliance.

Updates

The Fundraising Committee met on April 16, 2026, to continue planning efforts for the Pink Summer Soirée. The meeting was called to order at 7:04 PM, followed by a meditation led by Soror Brittany Wilson.

The committee reviewed key updates, including confirmation that a DJ and photobooth have been secured, with a contract pending. The silent auction will return this year, and ticket pricing has been established at \$100, increasing to \$110 after June 1, with VIP tickets starting at \$480. Sponsorship tiers (Tea Rose, Pearl, and Diamond) remain in progress.

Venue-related items are still pending, including confirmation of white chair covers and audiovisual setup. The committee also discussed chapter attire, opting against an all-white look and instead considering coordinated accessories.

Sponsorship planning focused on refining package structure and introducing a digital ad book to support promotion. Incentives for Sorors to drive sponsorships and ticket sales were also discussed.

Vendor planning included confirming the return of the cigar vendor, with outreach underway for additional vendors, including artists. Silent auction planning centered on identifying high-value items and beginning outreach for donations.

Live entertainment options were discussed, with next steps focused on aligning selections with the event budget and continuing outreach efforts.

The committee outlined next steps, including finalizing contracts, confirming venue details, completing sponsorship packages, and initiating outreach for vendors and auction items. Members were also encouraged to begin ticket purchases and promote the event broadly.

Anti Basileus - a critical role in our chapter, this soror will ascend to the office of the Basileus.

Tamiochus - another key role that manages our chapter's finances.

Ivy Leaf Reporter and Epistoleus - both offices that open annually

Two elected committees will also open: Nominating Committee and Finance Committee.

Anyone currently in these roles, excluding the Anti Basileus will need to run for the positions if they seek to continue in the role, pending any term limits.

Sorors should read and become familiar with the chapter bylaws to understand the requirements for these roles. The application will open after the June chapter meeting and will close by 11:59pm on the date of the September chapter meeting. You are encouraged to begin gathering your materials now, such as attendance, Leadership certificates, etc. At this time, please also prepare and submit your candidate materials, be creative!

Additionally, sorors should prepare to attend a virtual meeting, So You Want to Run for Office, to be held on June 16, 2026 at 7PM. This workshop will provide additional guidance to prepare you for running for a chapter office. Info presented will include
