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Student Conduct Code

Collegiate School aims to uphold the highest standards of conduct and to create an environment of respect towards others.

Anti – Bullying Policy

Harassment, intimidation or bullying means any offensive gesture written, verbal, or physical act towards another that takes place at Collegiate School. Collegiate School fosters an environment that instills in the students tolerance, acceptance, respect and understanding for everyone. It is expected that all members of the Collegiate community hold themselves to these standards. In an effort to foster a safe environment free of harassment, intimidation, and bullying, any of these acts by a Collegiate student, Faculty or staff member will not be tolerated and will result in non- attendance at Collegiate School.

Bullying can be defined as any gesture, written, verbal, or physical act that is reasonably perceived as being motivated by personal characteristics such as; ethnicity, gender, age, color, ancestry, national origin, gender identity, sexual orientation, religion, social status, mental handicap, physical handicap or physical appearance that:

A. a reasonable person should know, under the circumstances, that his/her behavior will have an effect of harming a person, damaging the person's property, or placing the person in reasonable fear of harm to his person or damage to his property or

B. has the effect of insulting or demeaning any student or group of students in such a way as to cause substantial disruption in the orderly operation of the school or their academic success.

The above also includes **cyber bullying**. Cyber-bullying involves the use of information and communication technologies (i.e. cell phones, email) or any online media venue (such as, Facebook, Myspace, Twitter, E-Mail, YouTube etc.) to support deliberate, repeated, and hostile behavior by an individual or group that is intended to harm or harass.

Student Policies

Students must adhere to the School's regulations with regards to using appropriate language at all times, taking responsibility for their own personal property during school time and maintaining satisfactory academic grades.

Uniform requirements are simple and limited in nature:

Grey or black dress slacks for all students, Collegiate school polo shirt with logo or white dress shirt. Solid color sneakers or dress shoes. Solid color sweaters when needed. (no designs)

A student's involvement in any activity in or out of school, of an illegal nature is grounds for dismissal from the school.

A student's readmission to Collegiate is contingent upon Administration review.

Cell phones, ipods, headphones or any other electronic equipment are not to be used during the school day. Personal computers or tablets can be used when necessary.

Student Rights Within the Instructional Context

To enhance the quality of student life and to maintain and improve the relationships between students and faculty, the Headmaster and faculty have adopted the following list of student rights within the instructional context:

1. Students may expect to receive throughout their attendance at Collegiate appropriate instruction to achieve the objectives of their courses.
2. Books for the classes will be provided to all the students at no cost.
3. Students should expect to have the opportunity to meet and discuss issues with the teachers and Headmaster at a mutually convenient time.
4. Students may expect assessments, written and oral, to be evaluated in writing within a reasonable time period.
5. Students have the right to be treated in the classroom in a dignified and respectful manner that is wholly free from discrimination based on any type of bias.
6. Students are hereby notified that the faculty, staff and Headmaster have the right to maintain order and respect for authority by eliminating or reducing student behavior that creates an unproductive and unsafe learning/teaching environment.
