Someone once said that it doesn't hurt to know people in high places because to get ahead in this world it's not what you know -- it's who you can count on.

For this season, I have been called to serve as your Interim Pastor. I come here having left a pastorate of 14+ years. Your previous pastor, Pastor Don, left claiming a new call upon his life after serving God with 17 years of faithful ministry to you. God is writing a new chapter for all of us. As I reflected on what to share in my pastor's column, I was led to a piece of Abram's story found in Genesis 12: 1-9.

Initially, God called Abram to leave his country, family, and ancestral lands to check out a new territory God was planning to give him. As encouragement for doing this, God made Abram fantastic promises, "I'll make you a great nation and bless you. I'll make you famous; vou'll be a blessing. I'll bless those who bless you; those who curse you I'll curse. All the families of the Earth will be blessed through you." What remains amazing about this contract with Abram is that it was a free gift (an indicator of the grace we speak about so much now). Abram was not required to make a specific commitment in return for God's blessing. It was not long until we see God upholding his promises - in spite of Abram - rather than because of him. Eventually, the same blessing promised to Abram was repeated to Isaac and Jacob. God continued to be faithful in keeping his initial promises to Abram and, as a result, humankind was delivered from the worst angels of their nature.

Abram trusted God's promises and left his homeland, with his immediate family, to follow

his call. God led him to glimpse the land called Canaan. It was occupied by another group of people, but God promised Abram that land would eventually belong to his descendants – a land full of rich resources and promise. Having received this promise, Abram built altars in two different locations near that land where he worshipped God and prayed. Scripture tells us all of God's promises to Abraham were kept. The covenant reached its fulfillment in Jesus – the God-With-Us who still lives in and through us today as a sign of God's neverending love for his people.

On the other side of this pandemic, I believe we are going to find God calling us to do church in new ways. Some people will not return to inperson church life, but new people will enter in. We must prepare ourselves for the changes because we are not going to return to the way things have always been. The technology the church has had to use through the COVID pandemic has opened new avenues for service and evangelism. Many have been reached with the Gospel and love of God that might not have been reached otherwise. Some of us might not have liked worshipping in this way, but isn't it beautifully creative that God found a way to not only protect us from physical harm, but also continue to reach us with the good news? To reach people with God's love in the future, we may need to spend less time in church buildings and more time on the streets, in places of business, in homes, and residential treatment centers. We are on the cusp of God doing a new thing. If we refuse to lean into the new thing God is doing - like Abram was willing to do - our personal spiritual growth and church life will begin to wither. It is a great time for First Christian Church, Beckley, to discern anew where God is leading. Yes, this church has known many sweet traditions, but it does not mean God does not have even sweeter traditions for us to discover. New is only as threatening as we make it up to be in our minds! Better and even more exciting things can be in the cards for this wonderful congregation if we will trust God and move forward with him step by step.

It is a privilege to walk this leg of your journey with you. I look forward to getting to know each of you personally – and that includes those

who are following through our live-streamed services. My love and prayers will surround you. Many blessings have been part of your past and deserve to be celebrated. Much richness is ahead of you. I look forward to discovering all of God's creative beauty in this congregation. I hope you find a blessing in rediscovering that beauty and celebrating with me the sure and certain future God has planned for you. Remember that Jesus said he has overcome the world and all within it. We can hope because all that would defeat us was crucified on the cross with Jesus. We are disciples of Jesus. His love and grace is still redeeming, transforming, and making new! We can count on him!

However, if you would like to receive ashes and a brief prayer, drive over to our church parsonage that day and Pastor Sharon (with mask and gloves) will impart everyone in your vehicle with ashes and share a prayer with you. You will not have to leave your vehicle. Pastor Sharon will be outside the church parsonage and ready to share ashes with you from 12:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. on February 17<sup>th</sup>.

Sharon will also be teaching a Bible Study during the weeks of Lent. The study will address the Sermon on the Mount, She will be using materials put together by Amy-Jill Levine, a professor of New Testament at Vanderbilt University. The study will be informative, thought-provoking, and accessible to everyone. You do not need to be a biblical scholar in order to get a blessing from it. The Bible Study will begin on Tuesday, February 23<sup>rd</sup>. It will be live streamed at 3:00 p.m., but will be available after that on the BeckleyDisciples Facebook page. ### **Community Service and Outreach**

Although our whole year of worship has changed this year, First Christian Church has taken part in some wonderful outreach projects. In the first part of 2020, our in-person services were cancelled, and worship took on a different look. Don and Becky began live-streaming services on Facebook which is a blessing for all of us

In August we had a visit from a group of Mabscott teachers who shared their experiences with us. This service opened our eyes to the challenges some students face locally. Their expression of thankfulness and love touched all our hearts. Our backpack drive provides supplies to teachers to meet their classroom needs, as well as supplies for individual students.

It was great to take part in the Day of Hope this year. Dr. Weis of Mabscott joined Don and I in the sock distribution area. We handed out socks to people as they made their way through the car lanes on their path through the event.

The congregation donated money this year to make online shoeboxes for the Samaritan's Purse project in October and November. We "made" 40 shoeboxes online. The shipping costs were also provided by our church and directly sent to the ministry.

In November, we provided a ham dinner for students at Mabscott for Thanksgiving. It included ham steaks, green beans, instant potatoes, and rolls.

For Christmas, Our Angel project provided 11 students with gifts for Christmas. This allows underprivileged students to receive some nice gifts that would otherwise be impossible. We worked with Food Lion again this year to provide food boxes that were distributed or delivered to the families.

It goes without saying that I will miss Don in Beckley. I reflect and am proud of all the

accomplishments we made together. But I am also happy for he and Nancy on beginning a new chapter in their lives.

2021 is here and Rev. Waters will be here to start her own new chapter in Beckley. So, like Don and Nancy, we are all listening to Him to see what plans He has for each of us.
