It is this same Spirit who abides with us today, and empowers us to be instruments of God's mercy in the world around us. Jesus' directive for ministry are still in place some 2000 years later. The challenge for the church of the 21st century is the nature of the world around us. We live in a post-Christian, secular world. This means that many our neighbors have heard the Gospel, and no longer claim it for their lives. Moreover, Christians will find themselves under increasing pressure to give into worldly desires when it comes to our teaching and practice.

This is borne out statistically. Worship attendance in this country is down to 25%-27% each week (a 10% drop in the last decade). The number of individuals claiming "no religious preference" is now over 20% in our country. These add all new meaning to Jesus' words, "the harvest is great, and the workers are few."

Whether we like it or not, or it fits in our comfort zone, we are to share Jesus with those around us. We need pray every day to be workers for the Gospel. However, we



must also accept Paul's mantra that we "plant and water, but God gives the increase."

This means we share Good News in word and work, and may never see the results. God knows, though, who we have touched, and the work we have done, and blesses us beyond measure when we allow our selves to be a blessing for Him.
