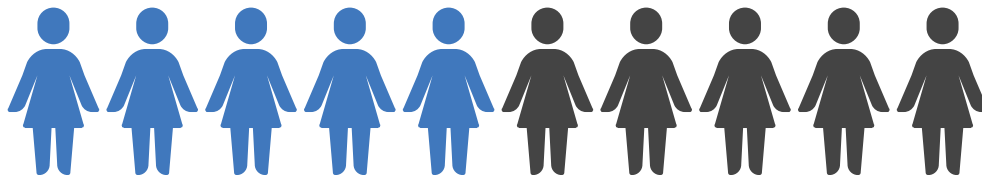

Without ERA, we would have seen an increase in evictions, displacement, and housing insecurity in a county that does not produce housing developments at an appropriate rate. ERA helped countless families stay afloat, but we still face housing underproduction and rising rents and home prices.

Brownsville, TX had the largest number of ERA recipients in a given area, with **2,720 households** receiving assistance and a total of **\$3,479,920.97** disbursed to families across Brownsville. Key areas of concentration include Southmost, Boca Chica, and Downtown Brownsville.

3,527 women applied for ERA, whether in dual or single-parent households. **1,677** of applicants were single mothers.
