ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF BROWNSVILLE

We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one (21) years or more, at least two of whom are citizens of the State of Texas, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF BROWNSVILLE.

ARTICLE II

The corporation is a non-profit organization.

ARTICLE III

The period of the duration of the corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE IV

The corporation is organized solely for charitable and educational purposes as these terms are defined under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). In this regard, its purposes will be to furnish assistance to projects and undertakings for the improvement of the public welfare in the Brownsville metropolitan area, and to participate in programs for the elimination of slum conditions, for urban redevelopment and for other programs and projects conducive to the progress of the community as such relate to adequate housing for persons with low and moderate income, and to the elimination of slum conditions and in connection therewith to do the following:

(a) Acquire, improve, hold, or dispose of land and real property and any interest therein:

- (b) Acquire, hold or dispose of funds and other property and any interest therein;
- (c) Make small loans to moderate and low income families for the prupose of improving their homes to comply with City Building Code standards:
- (d) Provide counselling services for low and moderate income families in all aspects of home ownership;
- (e) Make outright grants or loans or investments of its funds or property to either public authorities or private individuals and corporations in furtherance of its stated purposes, and to enter into contracts with public authorities, private persons, firms or corporations in connection therewith:
- (f) Carry on any activity for the purposes above stated, either directly or as agent, for or with other persons, firms or corporations, or in whole or in part through or by means of any other person, firm or corporation, and generally to do any and all further and other things which may be necessary or incidental to the purposes above stated, including the construction of improvements upon real property of the corporation or of others and the renting or leasing, sale or encumbrance of real, personal, or mixed property acquired by it, or the outright grant of any such property without consideration but in furtherance of such purposes.
- (g) Have all powers that may be conferred upon charitable corporations formed under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act.

All of the foregoing purposes and powers and all other purposes and powers in which the Corporation is permitted to engage by these Articles of Incorporation shall be exclusively for such public charitable and educational purposes as are within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). The COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF BROWNSVILLE will not engage in any activity which it cannot lawfully be engaged in without license under the laws of the State of Texas.

ARTICLE V

No part of any net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member or individual, and no substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. Upon any dissolution of the corporation no member shall be entitled to any distribution or division of its remaining property or its proceeds, and the balance of all money and other property received by the corporation from any source, including its operation, after the payment of all debts and obligations of the corporation of whatsoever kind and nature, shall be used or distributed, subject to the order of the Supreme Court of the State of Texas as provided by law, exclusively for purposes within those set forth in Article IV of these Articles and within the intendment of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

ARTICLE VI

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 1218 E. Jefferson St.. Brownsville. Texas 78520, and the official registered agent at such address is the Reverend Armand Mathew. O.M.I. The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors shall be nine (9), and the names and street addresses of the persons who are to serve as initial directors are:

TO THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 1396-4.03 of the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF BROWNSVILLE, a Texas Non-Profit Corporation which is subject to the provisions of the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, adopts the hereinafter stated Articles of Amendment to its Articles of Incorporation, which expands upon the purposes of the Corporation and states restrictions on the activities of the Corporation.

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of the corporation is Community Development Corporation of Brownsville.

ARTICLE II

SPECIFICATION OF AMENDMENTS

The following amendments to the Articles of Incorporation were adopted by the Corporation on September 9, 1986

Article Four of the Articles of Incorporation is hereby amended to read as follows:

The purpose or purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:

(A) General Purpose: This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

(B) Specific Purposes:

- 1. To furnish assistance to projects and undertakings for the improvement of the public welfare throughout the State of Texas, and to participate in programs for the elimination of slum conditions, for urban redevelopment and economic development for other programs and projects conductive to the progress of the community as such relate to adequate housing for persons with low and moderate income, and to the elimination of slum conditions and in connection therewith to do the following:
- 2. Acquire, improve, hold, or dispose of land and real property and any interest therein;
- 3. Acquire, hold or dispose of funds and other property and any interest therein;
- 4. Make loans to moderate and low income families for the purpose of improving their homes to comply with City Building Code standards and federal housing program requirements;
- 5. Provide counseling services for low and moderate income families in all aspects of home ownership and home improvement;
- 6. Make grants or loans or investments of its funds or property to either public authorities or private individuals and corporations in furtherance of its stated purposes, and to enter into contracts with public authorities, private persons, firms or corporations in connection therewith;

- 7. Carry on any activity for the purposes above stated, either directly or as agent, for or with other persons, firms or corporations, or in whole or in part through or by means of any other person, firm or corporation, and generally to do any and all further and other things which may be necessary or incidental to the purposes above stated, including the construction of improvements upon real property of the corporation or of others and the renting or leasing, sale or encumbrance of real, personal, or mixed property acquired by it, or the outright grant of any such property without consideration but in furtherance of such purposes.
- 8. Have all powers that may be conferred upon charitable corporations formed under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act.
- (C) Restrictions: The corporation will not carry on any activities as follows:
 - The corporation shall not devote more than an insubstantial part of its activities to attempting to influence legislation, or participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any or in opposition to any candidate for public office.
 - 2. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay

reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distribution in furtherance of its general and specific purposes set forth hereinabove.

- 3. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on:
 - (i) By a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law), or
 - (ii) By corporation contributions which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Coca of 1954 as amended (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Revenue law).
- 4. The assets of the corporation shall be dedicated and used only in furtherance of the general and specific purposes stated hereinabove. Upon dissolution of the Corporation, the assets will be turned over or distributed to another organization or organizations exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, or to governmental units or agencies, for a public purpose.

ARTICLE III

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 1396-4.03 of the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, the undersigned corporation adopts the following Articles of Amendment to its Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE ONE

The name of the corporation is COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF BROWNSVILLE.

ARTICLE TWO

The following amendment to the Articles of Incorporation was adopted at a meeting of the Board of Directors held on November 20, 1995, and received the vote of a majority of the directors in office, there being no members having voting rights in respect thereof.

The amendment adds Articles IX and X to the original Articles of Incorporation and the full text of each provision added is as follows:

ARTICLE IX.

A director or an officer are not liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for an act or omission in the director's or officer's capacity as director or officer except to the extent otherwise provided by a statute of the State of Texas.

ARTICLE X.

The Corporation may indemnify a person who was, is, or is threatened to be made a named defendant or respondent in litigation or other proceedings because the person is or was a director, an officer or other person related to the Corporation as provided by the provisions in the Act governing indemnification. As provided in the bylaws, the Board of Directors shall have the power to define the requirements and limitations for the Corporation to Indemnify directors, officers, members, or others related to the Corporation.
