This past June CBC conducted water baptisms at Farmington Lake. We were honored to baptize a BHH program participant, CBC member, and his stepson. The mother of the young man emotionally expressed how powerful it was for her son to make his own decision to get baptized.



This past year we have seen the tremendous growth of our organization. Convicted By Christ (CBC), through the miracle working power of God, navigated through the COVID pandemic to continue to provide services for men. It was evident that the men of CBC desired fellowship. From men coming to the backyard of Byron's House of Hope (BHH) to CBC's new home at Harvest of Hope Outreach Center, it was clear to us this past year that trials do not stop for illnesses. In fact, addictions were further exacerbated and men needing help to stay clean and sober and out of jail increased.

CBC Co-founder, Brian Myers, expressed to the group on a Thursday night that he had a calling from the Holy Spirit to start a "Blessing Bucket." Brian explained that he felt the Holy Spirit tell him to get a bucket, and as he went to get



a bucket, he felt the Holy Spirit impress on him to, "Get a bigger bucket." In obedience, Brian revealed a large 5-gallon bucket and expressed, "If you want to bless big you have to give big." Since the reveal of this bucket the men of CBC have given money, food, and clothing. The blessing's bucket will be used to help the men of the Thursday night group and the community.



"Keep sowing the word"

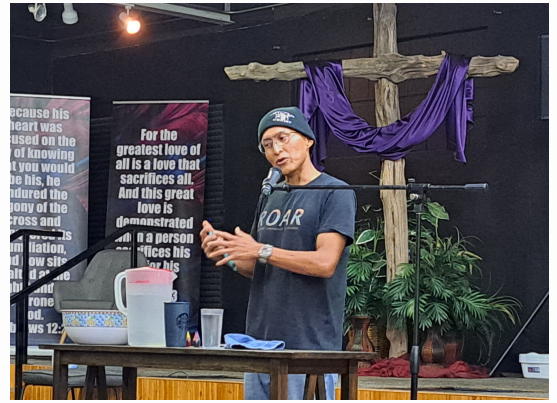

- Garden expansion
- Recruit House parents

- 2-3 cots for crisis management

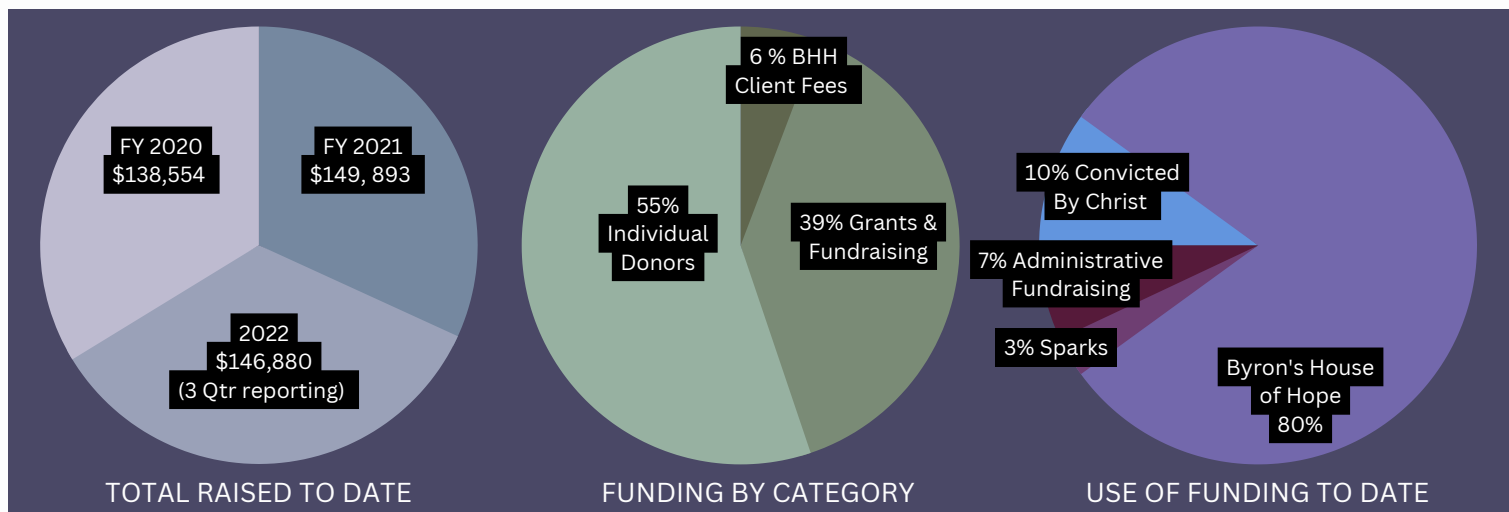
Bless Our Mess



This year marks our second year at 309 West Pinon Street in Farmington, NM. Since COVID initiated our hastily move, we had to balance meeting the needs of our men and bringing BHH into a fully functioning facility. We had to get the main sewer line replaced at the beginning of the year resulting in the front of our building being torn up. Secondly, we had electrical issues that lead to electricians to the street electrical box outside. Thirdly, we had a leak in the kitchen which resulted in getting our flooring project to be torn back up and water damage to our new cabinet install. Lastly, we had a jump in water usage leading to another chase that resulted in a broken water line. Overall, we are thankful to God for taking care of us as we seek to move BHH into the future. With the help of volunteers and local businesses we were able to get a lot done.



Financial Statements Snapshot FY 2020-2022

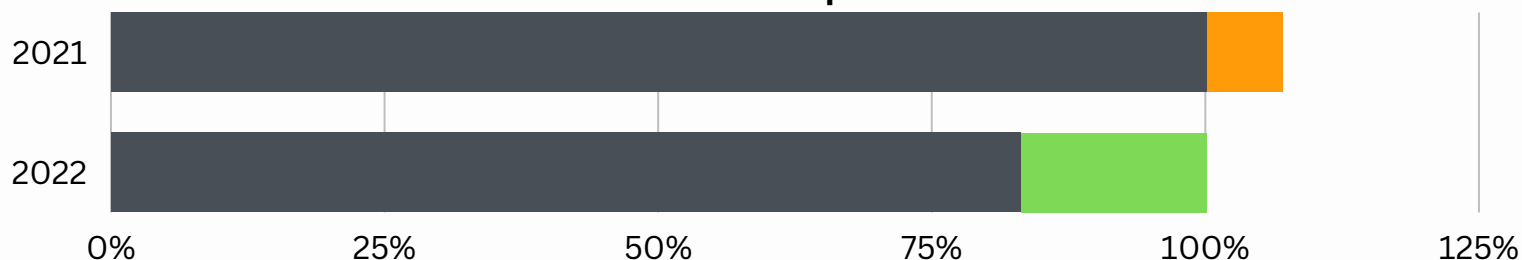


2021-2022 Revenue



- FY 2021 Projected revenue budget: \$117,100 versus actual revenue budget: \$149,893 (128%)
- FY 2022, Projected revenue budget: \$157,810 versus actual revenue budget: \$146,880 (93%) as of 9/30/2022

- 2021 Projected expenses budget \$117,100 versus actual expenses budget \$125,853.58 (107%)
- 2022 Projected expenses budget \$157,810 versus actual expenses budget \$131,355.91 (83%) as of 9/30/2022

Men Admitted BHH Program (Oct 2021-Oct 2022)



- BHH set out a yearly goal to admit 10 men.
- 10 out of 10 men were successfully admitted into the program.
- 5 out of the 10 men successfully completed the program.
- 2 out of 10 men returned to prison while in the program
- 3 out of 10 men are still currently in the program
