The Department of Labor and Industries is offering Public Works Contractors--particularly small-, women-, minority-, and veteran-owned—to provide input on:

- registered apprenticeship and compliance with utilization requirements,
- access to registered apprenticeship, and
- what's working and not working

We are conducting listening sessions to give you the opportunity to share your unique and important perspective so that we may share it with the systems that make policy and implement rules regarding registered apprenticeship.

This work is directed by [House Bill 1050](#) that also: 1) Expands current apprentice utilization requirements of [RCW 39.04.320](#); and 2) Requires the [Department of Labor and Industries](#) and the [Municipal Research Services Center](#) to provide training, information and technical assistance to help contractors comply with the law.
