

The mission of MCCL is training children and youth to glorify Jesus Christ through excellent choral singing. We honor and celebrate music as a gift from God by creating exceptional choral music, fostering community, and nurturing character.

Mission Fund Committee Report

The Mission Fund Committee convened for its second quarter meeting on May 6, 2025, in the church parlor. Members in attendance included Annette Propst (Chair), Jeff Jones, Nick Lovelace, Trevor Matthews, and Kristin Rinker.

Grant Requests Reviewed:

CVAN Men for Change Campaign: Kenny Propst presented a funding request on behalf of the Saint James Lutheran Men for the CVAN Men for Change campaign. This annual fundraiser plays a significant role in supporting CVAN's mission.

Cabarrus County Partnership for Children: Starla Hatley submitted a request to fund an educational initiative focused on safe sleep practices to reduce infant deaths related to co-sleeping and SIDS. The program includes the distribution of the board book Sleep Baby, Safe and Snug to families referred by local pediatric and family practice offices.

Grant Awards:

The committee awarded a total of \$2,100 in grant funding to support the initiatives of CVAN Men for Change and the Cabarrus County Partnership for Children.

The next quarterly meeting is scheduled for August 19, 2025.


