



THE FIRST READING: Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

¹After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." ² But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" ³ And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." ⁴ But the word of the Lord came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." ⁵ He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." 
THE SECOND READING: Philippians 3:17—4:1







THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION

Q: What is the Sacrament of the Altar?

THANK YOU!!

As the calendar has reached mid-March our hopes of making it through this heating season without another boiler failure (like last fall) become greater with each passing day. Prayers, Hail Mary's, Crossed fingers and toes ... whatever works ... the non-guaranteed repaired boiler has kept us warm.

Working with our boiler contractor, plans are in place to have new boilers installed, tested and ready to go for next heating season.

In response to our boiler needs, St. James' elected leadership turned to the Saints at St. James at the end of February with an invitation to offer \$150,000 during a Lenten Special Appeal to meet the \$38,000 repair cost to have heat this winter, the \$95,000 cost of new boilers and \$17,000 cost of contingencies and necessary new heating system parts.

Since the appeal was launched on February 23rd, you have responded! Holy Smokes, have you responded. As of March 10th, the Special Appeal has raised \$126,655 in gifts and pledges. That is 84% of our goal. Included in that figure are gifts from every member of Church Council and Pastor Bill.

God shows up at St. James and changes lives in this building. Yes, this money is going to something you will probably never see and will not think about (until it quits working). Boilers are not exciting. Without them, the building will not be warm and lives will cease to be changed to here.

THANK YOU for your generosity and working with your neighbors to expomentially increase our impact. When we work together our imaginations are the only limit to what God do with us and our community.

What if we raise more than our \$150,000 goal? What a great thing that would be! We would be prepared to meet the next property / equipment challenge. That opportunity is before us.

Every gift is important and makes a difference. Thank you for all you do make St. James a steward of God's grace. Please join us keeping St. James a place where God changes lives.
