#### **Grant Requests Reviewed:**

CVAN Men for Change Campaign: Kenny Propst presented a funding request on behalf of the Saint James Lutheran Men for the CVAN Men for Change campaign. This annual fundraiser plays a significant role in supporting CVAN's mission.

Cabarrus County Partnership for Children: Starla Hatley submitted a request to fund an educational initiative focused on safe sleep practices to reduce infant deaths related to co-sleeping and SIDS. The program includes the distribution of the board book Sleep Baby, Safe and Snug to families referred by local pediatric

and family practice offices.

#### **Grant Awards:**

The committee awarded a total of \$2,100 in grant funding to support the initiatives of CVAN Men for Change and the Cabarrus County Partnership for Children.

The next quarterly meeting is scheduled for August 19, 2025.


