

Lesson Summary

Lord of the Sabbath - Matthew 12:1-8

The Sabbath in Israelite history had become a mess of rules and regulations that oppressed the people rather than give them rest! The Story in Matthew 12 at first looks like it will show how to observe the Sabbath as a gift, and not a burden! Instead, the story is about the One who fulfills what Sabbath promises. It is about His authority and the blessings He brings. Jesus is a King, greater than His ancestor David. Jesus is the Son of Man, for He is the Creator and Redeemer. He is God, who gave Sabbath in the first place. As Lord of the Sabbath, He is able to provide good things: forgiveness, rest, and an eternal kingdom. Jesus, again,





restores the Sabbath to what God the Father intended!


Wonder Watchers, will be led by Karen Birkedal, inviting participants to reflect on how to stay awake to God's beautiful, watchful dream for the world.
