Lesson Summary

The Boy Jesus in the Temple - Luke 2:41-52

Today's lesson will cover two topics: a short video: "What is Good about Good Friday?", and Luke's record of Jesus as a 12-year-old in the Temple, one of the only Gospels that has stories of Jesus' youth. The Family goes to Jerusalem for the Passover feast, and when the family goes back home, they realize that Jesus isn't with them! Any parent knows the panic that this would cause, however, when they find him in the Temple, Jesus seems surprised at His earthly parents' response! Wonder Watchers, will be led by Karen Birkedal, inviting participants to reflect on how to stay awake to God's beautiful, watchful dream for the world.


