If you are uncomfortable with attending in-person, we will be live streaming the service. We will send out more information as it becomes available.

You are asked to bring a yard chair or blanket to sit on. Please understand that food will be prepared and provided based upon the sign ups. If you sign up and cannot attend, please let us know so that we can adjust as needed.

#### From the Pastor

O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever. ~Psalm 107:1

After a year of waiting, we finally resumed in-person worship on March 7, and although we are socially distanced, wearing masks, and not singing, it is good to be back worshipping and praising God together. As we transition to in-person worship we will continue to offer on-line opportunities, including a live streaming of the worship service beginning hopefully on Sunday, March 14. We are also in the process of planning Holy Week and Easter and will be getting more information to you as it becomes available.

For the remainder of March we will continue to review health guidelines and our procedures for worship safety, and slowly and safely expand worship to include Holy Communion. We will also be planning Holy Week and Easter services and will provide information as it becomes available.

In April we will develop a plan to gradually open for other in-door activities including Adult Sunday School, Bible studies, and mid-week services. All of this of course is contingent upon changes in the COVID numbers, Governor Cooper and NC Synod recommendations, and CDC guidelines.

There is one event to make you aware of. On April 11, prior to worship, we will hold our bi-annual congregational meeting to approve the 2020 annual report, elect a nominating committee and voting members for the NC synod assembly, and consider other business as necessary.

The nominating committee is responsible for putting together a slate of names for the 2021 church council election in November. This year's Synod Assembly is scheduled for June 3-5 and will be virtual. St James is eligible to be represented by three voting members — one male, one female, and one young adult (18-30). If you are interested in serving in either of these capacities, or would like to nominate someone, please contact the church office.

While we make plans and move forward there is still a bit of uncertainty, but there is one thing we are not uncertain of, God's steadfast love. So God's blessings in the days and weeks to come as we prepare to hear once again the story of Christ's passion and resurrection with new hearts!



#### SUNDAYS IN FEBRUARY

### SUNDAY, MARCH 7 3RD SUNDAY IN LENT



The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The commandments begin with

the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit-making can become our gods. The Ten Commandments are essential to our baptismal call: centered first in God's liberating love, we strive to live out justice and mercy in our communities and the world.

**Gospel: John 2:13-22** 

#### SUNDAY, MARCH 14 4TH SUNDAY IN LENT



The fourth of the Old Testament promises providing a baptismal lens this Lent is the promise God makes to Moses: those who look on the bronze serpent will live. In

today's gospel Jesus says he will be lifted up on the cross like the serpent, so that those who look to him in faith will live. When we receive the sign of the cross in baptism, that cross becomes the sign we can look to in faith for healing, for restored relationship to God, for hope when we are dying.

Gospel: John 3:14-21

### SUNDAY, MARCH 21 5TH SUNDAY IN LENT



God promises Jeremiah that a "new covenant" will be made in the future: a covenant that will allow all the people to know God by heart. The church sees this promise fulfilled in Christ, who draws all people to

himself when he is lifted up on the cross. Our baptismal covenant draws us to God's heart through Christ and draws God's love and truth into our hearts. We join together in worship, sharing in word, song, and meal, and leave strengthened to share God's love with all the world.

Gospel: John 12:20-33

## SUNDAY, MARCH 28 PALM SUNDAY



This week, the center of the church's year, is one of striking contrasts: Jesus rides into Jerusalem surrounded by shouts of glory, only to be left alone to die on the cross, abandoned by even his closest

friends. Mark's gospel presents Jesus in his complete human vulnerability: agitated, grieved, scared, forsaken. Though we lament Christ's suffering and all human suffering, we also expect God's salvation: in the wine and bread, Jesus promises that his death will mark a new covenant with all people. We enter this holy week thirsty for the completion of God's astonishing work.
