CCM FOOD FOOD NEEDS



C O O P E R A T I V E C H R I S T I A N M I N I S T R Y

June was not quite as busy as July at our food pantries, but at the Crisis Center we still served the 5th most households in our history. So three of the top five months in our history have been in 2023! After being closed for a week at the end of June and beginning of July for inventory, the holiday, and resetting, we reopened to a record 94 households served in one day (between 2 shifts). Our CEO, Ed Hosack, explained so well in his July newsletter article about why this is happening in the midst of an apparently booming economy https://cooperativeministry.com/news/

Meanwhile, our inventory remains very low. It is not too late to consider sponsoring a special summer food drive for CCM! We can ALWAYS use more plastic grocery bags!

Pantry items needed:

- Canned Chicken
- Other Canned Meats (Hash, Chili, Vienna Sausages, etc.)
- Canned peas, carrots, potatoes and mixed vegetables

- Pasta Sauce
- Any kind of canned beans (Pinto, Chili, Kidney, etc.) except for baked beans/pork & beans
- Peanut Butter
- Macaroni & Cheese
- Any Canned Fruit (Mixed, Peaches, Pears, Pineapple, etc.)
- Cereal
- Toilet Paper and Paper Towels

A SEED FROM THAT FATEFUL APPLE Bishop Tim Smith

First of all, I know very little about Artificial Intelligence, or Al. I do know that I have bishop colleagues in other synods who



have picked a random selection of lectionary assigned texts—let's say the 10th Sunday after Pentecost, year A—and asked the AI program to write a sermon to a Lutheran congregation for that day. These bishops say they have to admit that on a content level, the AIgenerated sermon was theologically and exegetically probably better than they might hear in at least half of their congregations on a given Sunday. And to think, back in the 60s we thought the Dick Tracy telephone watch and the Jetsons' robo vacuum were technological impossibilities!
