

The CCM non-perishable food situation is getting critical! Our inventory is extremely low, while we continue to see a 30% increase in the number of households seeking food assistance over a year ago.

A collection box will be in the Portico area.


SARAH'S SONG COMING TO KANNAPOLIS Local Church to Present Original Musical

Members of Kimball Memorial Lutheran Church and The First Presbyterian Church of Kannapolis along with Dance Dreams Studio will present an original musical drama based on the lives of Sarah and Abraham from the Bible on September 14th and 15th at 7:30 pm at Kimball Memorial Lutheran Church in Kannapolis.

The story originates in Harran, Mesopotamia in approximately the year 2000 BC. As the prologue tells us, "Empires are disintegrating, people are leaving and smaller city-states and fiefdoms are springing up. In the Chaldean Empire, in the city of Harran, Sarah and Abraham

are on the move." Their arrival in Canaan as they might have supposed, was not the end of their journey. From the harem in Egypt to the Mount Moriah altar, their quest to follow God tested the metal of a man and drew forth the heart of a woman.

The role of Sarah is played by Lucinda Stewart and the role of Abraham is played by Whit Whitley. Sarah's Song contains 11 original songs and an original script by Don and Kay Simmons. Don is the Music Director at Kimball Memorial Lutheran Church, a former college instructor, secondary school teacher, and accompanist for the Piedmont Choral Society. 
