

2ND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY



HYMNS FOR JANUARY 19

Three of our hymns this week use the verse/refrain structure that we frequently associate with popular music. Hopefully these three are already familiar to you (very, very familiar, I bet), but if not, just press play!

Our Communion hymn is another of the first-generation (early 16thcentury, that is) Lutheran chorales that purposefully seek to update even older Catholic music. I say "another" because we're already singing one each week as the Agnus Dei of our musical liturgy. "Lamb of God, Pure and Sinless" follows a pattern that Luther established as he and others began translating Catholic music into German service chorales designed to be sung by the congregation: in addition to the original Latin text. an explanation is included to lead the singer to a greater understanding of what's being sung.
