Light shines in the darkness for the upright, the psalmist sings. Isaiah declares that when we loose the bonds of injustice and share our bread with









### NATIONAL LUTHERAN CHOIR TOUR


The award-winning National Lutheran Choir, based in Minneapolis, will be touring the Southeastern U.S. with three FREE
