
Worship Bulletin - May 10

If you've been joining us for Sunday worship, you know I've been pairing Gregorian chant (Gerald Near's pieces with Latin titles) and Easter hymn settings by Sebastian Bach. While both beautiful and utterly appropriate for worship (the chants, in fact, are appointed specifically for the day you hear them), they likely are unfamiliar to you. I hope today's Scooby Snack will offer music with which you'll be able to hum along. - **Rob**
