encourage everyone to wear masks during worship. Congregational singing has resumed with masks.



Our local food pantries are in critical need of non perishable food supplies for those in need. Our Scout Pack, Troop and Ship are collecting nonperishable food supplies for our Scouting For Food Drive next week. If you could please drop off food supplies in the portico area (or outside the portico door), we

If you don't want to purchase canned goods, an option is to make a monetary donation to Cooperative Christian Ministry and we will deliver it to them. Each dollar donated purchases 7 pounds of food!

CCM FOOD PANTRY JANUARY

Hope everyone is doing well and staying well and that your 2022 is off to a great start. We are so grateful to all our community partners who make it



possible for us to distribute food to many of our neighbors in need. In 2021, we averaged serving 1,000 households a month across all of our food programs (fixed pantries, mobile food pantries, delivery programs, school backpacks, etc.), representing about 3,000 individuals. Over the course of the year we distributed a little more than 1 million pounds of food. About 10% of that was collected and donated by churches.


