
The Health and Safety Committee and Church Council strongly encourage everyone to wear masks during worship. There will be no congregational singing at this time.

SUNDAY'S COOL! **SEPTEMBER 27. 2021** WELCOME TO SUNDAY'S COOL! LOVE ONE ANOTHER! **HAPPY FALL YA'LL!** Yep! It's official! Fall is here! That means cooler weather, it gets dark earlier and before we know it, we will get an extra our of sleep when the time changes. WAHOOO! So what do you do this time of year? CREATING MEMORIES OF FAITH IN THE FALL OF THE YEAR BY BECOMING A GOOD STEWARD: Whatever you do, don't forget to take Flat Jesus with you and take a photo to Get up early on November 19, take five minutes and go outside. Look to the eas and you should see the Leonid Meteor Shower rocking really well. What a family memory maker that will last a lifetime. Last week we talked about making a compost pile from the leaves that drop from the trees in your yard. Add a little excitement to your compost pile, buy a couple the tree in your yath. And a flike exclusionment to your Compost pile, buy a coping boxes of fishing worms to add to your compost pile. They love organic material, except things like citrus fruit and onions, and they serate and help fertilize your compost pile. Turn your leaves over about once a month and the worms will continue their job with new territory to discover. After awhile, you can find enough worms for an afternoon of fishing. enougn worms for an atternoon or issning.

Want to make a rain barrelf for those hot summer days next year? We have a few black barrels that make great rain barrels, you are welcome to one. Pick up your rain barrel, go to the plumbing department at Lowe's and you can find adaptor and a spigot so you can connect your hose to your new barrel. You can go on line to you tube, https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hSad3h780bl, and it will tely you step by step. It's perfect for the garden and flowers. It's free water, saves money, and for some reason, plants grow better with natural rain water than city water. This is a great family project.
