

The purpose of the study is to share information, clarify needs for ministry, and explore the congregation's history and vision for the future. The information gathered is used by the Bishop and staff to identify good pastoral candidates; by the call committee as they prepare the ministry site profile and interview candidates; and by each candidate as they consider the call to this congregation.

Following the worship service Sunday, October 16 the congregation is invited to meet in the fellowship hall for a light lunch (*Please help us plan for lunch by making a reservation*) and to participate in the Congregational Study. Pastor Danielle DeNise, a member of the Bishop's staff, will lead the congregational study.

In the CCM Food program, our numbers remain high and we continue

to serve a LOT of households who are new to CCM. Our inventory is getting critically low!

Currently, the pantry items we are in biggest need of are:

- Any kind of canned vegetables, especially green beans and corn
- Diced Tomatoes
- Dried Pinto Beans
- Any kind of canned beans (Baked, black, pinto, kidney, etc.)
- Canned Fruit (except fruit cocktail)
- Any kind of Canned Meats (except tuna!)
- Macaroni & Cheese
- Pasta Sauce
- Toilet Paper and Paper Towels

As always, we especially seek low sodium items, no-added-sugar items, and whole grain items.

A Somber Experience




I visited Fort Myers yesterday. It was a difficult trip, and I was on the road for more than 10 hours. President Biden and Governor DeSantis were visiting town as well (I didn't meet them). They put their political differences aside and committed to aid this devastated community. It took a hurricane for them to agree on something, but they did it, and we thank them.

Hurricane Ian has wrought death, devastation, uncertainty, sadness, and trauma. Thousands of people are numb. This is particularly evident in Ft. Myers Beach. The sound of the helicopters has turned into a somber experience knowing they bring dead bodies from Fort Myers Beach.

I was only able to go as far as Ft. Myers, so I visited Peace Lutheran Church where I met Pastor Andreas Stein and Pastor Jhon Freddy Correa, Dean of our Caloosa Conference. I heard heartbreaking stories from them about how their parishioners and neighbors are suffering. I saw the heavily damaged neighborhoods surrounding the churches.


