



FROM OUR INTERIM PASTOR

Dear people of St. James,

I am honored and excited to serve as your interim pastor until such time as the Holy Spirit reveals to you the person whom he has already chosen to



minister with you in the years to come. I officially retired in May of 2020, and St. James is my second interim assignment; I come to you from Holy Trinity, Mt. Pleasant, where I have been serving for two years and four months. It seems that I am going to have the opportunity to become well acquainted with Cabarrus County!

The moment you hear me speak you will realize that I am not a North Carolina native. I grew up in York, Pennsylvania, and after earning my bachelor's degree at Cornell University, I taught high school English at my alma mater for seven years. Then the Holy Spirit "nudged" me toward what was then Gettysburg Seminary. I have been serving in this synod ever since my graduation from Gettysburg in 1984. I am married to Marian, a retired high school math teacher who somehow keeps being called back to substitute again and again. She has been an indispensable partner in my ministry for thirty-seven years. We do not have children, and we have often said that, given our track record of killing plants by failing to water them, it's good that we never had any, because we almost certainly would have forgotten to feed them!

I live in Thomasville, almost an hour's drive away. I plan to be in Concord four times a week: Sunday (of course), Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday. I hope to be a little more specific about the times when you may find me in the office as soon as I have clearer idea of the times of standing meetings and other obligations. However, in case of an emergency (like a hospitalization in the intensive care unit), I want to be available to you on whatever day you need me. Feel free to call me at any time, and please understand that it will take a little more than an hour for me to get to you if I am not in town that day.

I don't have a Facebook or Twitter account or use any other social media platform. I do send and receive text messages, and you may feel free to contact me that way.

My plan is to visit with as many of you as possible over the next few months. Not only will our conversations help me to get to know you; they will also help me to understand St. James and its history, priorities, and values. Shut-ins may expect a visit once a month. But rest assured that I will never just "show up" at your house without calling first—unless you have told me in advance that I am free to come whenever I want without calling. (I certainly don't expect most of you to do that!)

The interim between pastors is a time of transition, and transitions are filled with uncertainty. A period in the life of this congregation that has been very meaningful for many of you has come to an end, and it is completely normal to feel a sense of loss. What's more, you can't know what lies ahead for you or what that unknown future will ask of you. But, at the same time, these days can be filled with excitement and new possibilities. I consider it a privilege to be allowed by God to walk, to worship, and to serve with you during this time. Yours in Christ, Pastor Craig Saltzer

CCM FOOD PANTRY

In the CCM Food program, our numbers remain high and we continue to serve a LOT of households who are new to CCM. Our inventory is getting critically low!

Currently, the pantry items we are in biggest need of are:

- Any kind of canned vegetables, especially green beans and corn
- Diced Tomatoes
- Dried Pinto Beans
- Any kind of canned beans (Baked, black, pinto, kidney, etc.)
- Canned Fruit (except fruit cocktail)
- Any kind of Canned Meats (except tuna!)
- Macaroni & Cheese
- Pasta Sauce
- Toilet Paper and Paper Towels


