### **IN-PERSON WORSHIP**

In-person worship has been delayed due to the latest guidelines from Governor Cooper. See letter below.



To the saints at St. James Lutheran Church,

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, for months we have been busy establishing policies and procedures to ensure as safe a return to worship as possible. We now have everything in place to return to in-person worship and had

hoped to do just that on November 15. But with the recent spike in COVID cases and Governor Cooper's most recent announcement reducing in-door gatherings from 25 to 10 and outside gatherings from 75 to 50, the council voted Tuesday evening to not meet in person this coming Sunday, November 15.

We know some of you will be disappointed with this decision...we are disappointed as well. While we are not required to follow Governor

Cooper's restrictions or our Synod's recommendations, we have prayerfully made this decision out of love and concern for the health and safety of our church family and community, particularly the most vulnerable among us.

The Council is scheduled to meet again in two weeks to evaluate available information and consider a date to return to in person worship. In the meantime we will continue to offer weekly worship on Sunday mornings via YouTube and Facebook, drive-in Holy Communion Services on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month, gather food for CCM and other helping agencies, and begin to plan activities and services for Advent and Christmas (inside and outside) that allow us to gather as safely as possible.

Please let us know if you have questions or concerns, and as always, remember we are not alone in these uneasy times – God is with us and faithful – and that makes all the difference.
