FROM THE PASTOR

November and its celebration of Thanksgiving is often thought of as a time of giving thanks and appropriately so... especially this year, for after 18 months of

masks and social distancing we are finally seeing a light at the end of the tunnel. There is much reason to be thankful...including the discovery of what we already knew to be true...that God is faithful.

November also marks the end of the church calendar. It begins with All Saints

Sunday (November 7) where we remember those brothers and sisters in Christ who now rest in the Lord and for whose lives and witness to God we give thanks; and it ends with Christ the King Sunday (November 21), another day of remembering and giving thanks, for unlike the governments and leaders of this world who disappoint us and prove undependable, God is just, righteous, slow to anger, abounding in steadfast love.

As part of our life together, at the conclusion of worship on November 21, we will hold a congregational meeting to consider a 2022 ministry spending plan and elect church council members.

At the conclusion of worship on November 14 the council will offer a question and answer time in the sanctuary. If you have questions or concerns about the proposed budget and cannot attend on November 14 please forward them to the church office.

While there are four positions open on council for 2022, the ballot proposed by the nominating committee currently includes only three individuals open to serving (Elizabeth Hurley, Frank Irvin, Dee Pieschel). We will continue to receive names through November 14. If you would like to nominate someone for council please complete a nomination form and return it to the church office. Copies of the form are available at the same locations as the church budget.

This is a very important process; it provides shape and leadership for our shared ministry and stewardship of God's good creation; and I encourage you to attend.

No matter what lies before us, I remain thankful and hopeful for the ministry we share together... not because of our gifts and faithfulness, but for the love and faithfulness of the one who entrusts us with good gifts and makes our faithfulness and lives possible...the God we worship as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

CCM FOOD PANTRY

NOVEMBER

In the CCM Food Program, we have become increasingly aware that there are some hard-working folks in our community who are still food-insecure. Whether they are not being paid livable wages, or because of the skyrocketing housing costs, or for



others reasons, they still face difficult decisions about food purchases and find themselves unable to adequately provide for their families. However, because of their work hours they are unable to visit our Crisis Center pantry during our regular hours, without taking time off from work (often unpaid). To alleviate this, we have decided to open up one evening a week. **Beginning November 4th we will reopen our Crisis Center drive-through pantry from 3:30 to 6:30 pm.** Obviously, this move will probably increase the overall demand for food.

Our current big needs are:

- Chili with Meat

STEWARDSHIP SEASON

It's not recognized as liturgical, but it's here in most of our congregations nevertheless: Stewardship Season. It usually coincides with another

important but less visible season: Budget Time. For many, neither is

among the more enjoyable or inspiring periods of our church year.

As a young pastor, I loathed that season, in part because of people's pushback. "That's all the church cares about—the Almighty Dollar!" "Do we have to talk about money ALL the time!!??" "Yeah, sure, that little preacher wants us to give more to the church because he thinks he needs and deserves a raise. Well, somebody should tell him, in the REAL world...." "Preacher, we really like you, but people are starting to complain. We're not used to hearing about money from the pulpit!"

Mark's Gospel of late repeatedly reminds us that servanthood is what makes us great. How does that apply to our money? Well, money itself has no intrinsic value. It's only as good as that for which it can be exchanged. What if we thought about money—and time and talent—as stored servanthood? What if we looked at our checkbook registers and credit card statements and online banking and asked, "How am I releasing what is entrusted to me as a follower and servant of Christ?" Or not, as the case may be?
