

THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The

commandments begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit-making can become our gods. The Ten Commandments are essential to our baptismal call: centered first in God's liberating love, we strive to live out justice and mercy in our communities and the world.

IN-PERSON WORSHIP RESUMING

March 7, 2021

As North Carolina's numbers continue to show improvement and vaccine distribution increases, Governor Roy



Cooper announced that beginning Friday at 5:00 pm the state will carefully ease some of its COVID-19 restrictions.

We will resume In-Person Worship at St. James on Sunday, March 7. Please review the Procedures for Resuming In-door Worship below.

An Online Service will still be available on Facebook and YouTube.

Procedures for the Resuming of In-door Worship

Saint James Lutheran Church Approved by Church Council

ARRIVAL

- 1. The only entrance to the church will be through the front (Union Street) and garden (ramp) doors leading into the narthex. These doors and the doors to the sanctuary will be left open for ventilation.
- 2. There will be someone outside the entrance doors to take temperatures. They will maintain social distance while greeting worshipers. *Individuals with a temperature of 100 or higher will not be permitted to enter.*
- 3. Signage will be placed along the walkways to the doors emphasizing social distancing, the expectations for the wearing of masks, and other relevant information.
- 4. Tape will be used as markers on the walkways to maintain appropriate distance between groups if they must wait to be seated.

- 5. There will be a check-in station at each door. All worshippers will check in and provide a contact number for tracing purposes if necessary.
- 6. Worshippers will be escorted to their seats through the center (double) doors.

SEATING

- 1. For social distancing purposes and to reduce the likelihood of overcrowding, the congregation will be seated according to a council approved seating schematic developed by the Health and Safety Committee.
- 2. Seating will occur in every other row of seats in the sanctuary. Signs will be placed in rows where seating is not allowed. ["PLEASE LEAVE THIS ROW VACANT"]
- 3. The balcony will not be used.

DURING WORSHIP

- 1. No nursery will be provided at this time.
- 2. Offering will be received in plates located at the entrance to the sanctuary.
- 3. Bulletins will be handed out by the ushers during the service and available digitally for those who use a tablet or phone.
- 4. There will be no congregational singing.

DISMISSAL AFTER SERVICE

- 1. The congregation will be reminded before the end of service of procedures to follow after dismissal.
- 2. At the conclusion of worship, worshippers will be dismissed by row and section through the center doors to reduce the crowding that currently occurs at the entrance to the sanctuary.
- 3. Worshipers will exit through the narthex and not stop or gather in the sanctuary, the entrance to the sanctuary, or on the ramp.
- 4. Pastor Tony will move to the Portico entrance to talk with members that wish to drive by and speak with him.



DRIVE-IN WORSHIP AND COMMUNION

March 10 at 6:30 pm

In order to provide an opportunity to safely worship and commune together in the same place and see some of our church friends from a distance, there will be a Drive-In Communion service on Wednesday, March 10 at 6:30 p.m. We will be gathering in the Garden Lot at St.

James. We ask that you drive into the lot and park in

alternating spaces. More details and the bulletin will be sent next week.

Drawing from a Japanese tradition, Sekino began to fold paper cranes to give to patients — and soon his

efforts were multiplied when people in Japan sent thousands of paper cranes to the hospital. "Paper cranes now are a spot of healing for [patients]," Sekino said.
