






CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL

On May 8 we will bless the Lutheran World Relief Mission Quilts made by our Quilting Ministry at St. James.

In 1945 LWR distributed its first quilts to families in war-torn Europe, following the Second World War. Within a decade, the ministry was reaching around the globe to villages far removed from the world's attention. Today, an average of 300,000 quilts are lovingly given worldwide each year.

SOCIAL MINISTRY

CCM FOOD PANTRY APRIL

March was a surprisingly busy month for the Food Program. Our pantries served the most households since November, and the second-most in the past year. Except for a couple of big church food drives, this is a slim time donation-wise, and our inventory is beginning to shrink quite a bit. We welcome all food drives and donations!

In the very near future, we will be launching a new initiative in partnership with the Cabarrus Health Alliance's maternity clinic and at least one of our local crisis pregnancy centers. We plan to provide special boxes or bags of food specially designed **for expectant mothers**. There are some special items we could use for those boxes, including:

- Peanut Butter
- Dried Beans
- Instant Brown Rice (bags or box)
- Whole Wheat Crackers (Triscuits or Wheat Thins)
- Dried Fruit/Raisins

Currently, the pantry items we are in biggest need of are:

- Toilet Paper and Paper Towels
- Dried Beans
- Canned Fruit
- Canned Chicken
- Other Canned Meats (except tuna!)
- Spaghetti and other Dried Pasta

As always, we especially seek low sodium items, no-added-sugar items, and whole grain items.

CAMP COUNSELOR



- Located in Fuquay-Varina, NC on 400+ acres of forested land along the Cape Fear River in Harnett County (about an hour south of Raleigh)
- Small group based ministry, no more than 50 campers onsite at a time and no more than 8 campers in a cabin allowing for counselors to form close connections with

campers

- Christian camp whose goal is to build self-esteem and self-value in all campers, and to show them that are loved and cherished as they are.
- Summer dates: from June 5- August 9th (beginning with two weeks of staff training included)
- Starting rates for counselors: \$300 per week (plus lodging & meals, of course)
- Hiring for Support Staff (high school students) and Counselors (college) See more info on the employment page link below!
- Rising and newly graduated high school seniors (minimum age is 17 y/o) are eligible to serve on our summer support staff team (they don't have responsibility for a specific cabin group)

Some benefits of working on summer staff at Camp Agape' include: new friends, experiencing a truly Christ-centered community and being given the opportunity to share the love of God with campers who might not always get that. There are so many skills that you can gain from a summer at camp; communication, adaptability, leadership, etc., but the greatest part is the community of staff and campers that you get to be a part of.

We have a particular need for a **lifeguard**, should you have that certification.


