


Retail prices for groceries are up anywhere from 50 to 100% from 2021. As a result, the food stamp allotments folks are still getting are only worth about half what they were before the pandemic hit. That, combined with the crazy costs of housing, is placing an unbearable burden on our lower-income neighbors-even many who are working full-time. Thus, it is not surprising that we are beginning to see a significant surge in the numbers of households seeking food assistance at all our pantries. We have a continued need for a LOT of donated non-perishable foods!

Currently, the pantry items we are in biggest need of are:

- Canned Chicken
- Other Canned Meats (Hash, Chili, Vienna Sausages, etc.)
- Canned peas, carrots, and potatoes
- Low Salt Corn and Green Beans
- Any kind of canned beans (Baked, Chili, Kidney, etc.) except for green beans and pintos
- Any Canned Fruit (Mixed, Peaches, Pineapple, etc.) except for pears
- Pasta

As always, we especially seek low sodium items, no-added-sugar

items, and whole grain items.
