

MAY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS



Committee report highlights and actions taken during council meeting:

- Youth and Family has several key upcoming events including Port-a-Pit with Calvary this Friday, College Mission Trip May 15-19, Youth Beach Trip June 17-24, Youth Mission Trip to Altoona, Pa. July 2-8 and VBS July 30-Aug. 1.
- Evangelism is working on pairing congregants with new members to help get them more involved and connected beyond just attending Sunday worship.
- Mutual Ministry is continuing with staff evaluations this month.
- Parish Life and Fellowship Committee are creating a survey to gauge people's preference regarding Wednesdays Together.
- The Council approved an automated door lock/unlock schedule and an automated alarm schedule that was recommended by the Property Committee to improve the safety of the building.
- Mission Fund approved funds for Scout Troop and Pack 91 for summer camp scholarships and St. James Capital Fund to help with major building projects.

I have exciting news to share! Last week, synod leadership set the audacious goal of helping to pay every NC Synod youth's registration fee for the upcoming 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering! Synod Council and other leaders have already pledged \$40,000 to our goal of \$200,000.

COOPERATIVE MAY FOOD NEEDS


We continue to experience a big surge in requests for food assistance, especially from families with children. Through the first two weeks of May we have already served 475 households! We did not receive nearly as much from the Letter Carrier's Stamp Out Hunger Food drive as we had hoped—only 1,775 lbs. so far. So our inventory remains VERY low.

Currently, the pantry items we are in biggest need of are:

- Canned Chicken
- Other Canned Meats (Hash, Chili, Vienna Sausages, etc.)
- Canned corn
- Canned peas, carrots, potatoes and mixed vegetables
- Low Salt Corn and Green Beans
- Any kind of canned beans (Baked, Chili, Kidney, etc.) except for pintos
- Rice (1 or 2 lb. bags please)
- Any Canned Fruit (Mixed, Peaches, Pineapple, etc.) except for pears

As always, we especially seek low sodium items, no-added-sugar items, and whole grain items.

All items can be dropped off in the Portico area and we will be sure that the items are taken to CCM.
