FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



A woman finds healing by

touching Jesus' cloak, and a girl is restored to life when he takes her by the hand. In both cases a boundary is crossed: in Jesus' time the hemorrhaging woman was considered ritually unclean, polluting others by her touch, and anyone who touched a corpse also became unclean. In Mark's gospel Jesus breaks down barriers, from his first meal at a tax collector's house to his last breath on the cross as the temple curtain is torn in two. We dare to touch Jesus in our "uncleanness" and to live as a community that defines no one as an outsider.

CCM FOOD PANTRY

As we move into summer, lots of folks finally are getting away on vacations, etc. Churches are planning VBS and other special summer activities. It is easy to forget about CCM and other local ministries. But we are still here, and still serving a lot

of folks in crisis. While our numbers are down a lot from a year ago, our Crisis Center drive-through pantry still is serving an average of about 110 households a week. Many of these are senior adults or individuals on disability who are not receiving the food stamp bonuses like families with children. So, please consider doing some special food drives for CCM this summer. Let me know if you have any questions or any ways we can support you.




REFLECTIONS FROM ST. JAMES' VOTING MEMBER, Christine Lovelace

The synod staff worked really hard to create a program with videos and presentations that taught me so much about the work that ELCA does throughout the state to provide outreach and support to many different communities in need, and in a variety of ways. As a lifelong Lutheran the assembly reaffirmed for me the values and teachings I grew up with and hope to pass along to future generations.
