NINTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Today is the first of five Sundays with gospel readings from John 6, the first four of



which focus on Jesus as bread of life. Today Jesus feeds thousands of people with five loaves and two fish. What we have, what we bring to Jesus' table, seems like it is not nearly enough to meet all the needs we see around us. But it is not the adequacy of our supplies or our skills that finally makes the difference: it is the power of Jesus working in the littlest and least to transform this world into the world God desires, a world where all the hungry are satisfied.

CHURCH NEWS



FROM THE PASTOR

Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth. Sing to the Lord, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works

among all peoples. For great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised; he is to be revered above all gods. (Psalm 96:1-4)

Both during the pandemic with the recorded worship services and since we have returned to live worship, the two questions I have heard most are: "Why are we not singing?" and "When are we going to resume singing?" It is completely understandable that we miss singing in worship. Music plays an important part in Lutheran liturgy; it enriches our worship life together. Luther himself commended music as an "excellent gift of God;" a gift I suggest, like everything we have, that is to be used for the enjoyment of life with God, the praising of God, and the work of God's kingdom.

And from that perspective, while we have not been singing as a congregation, in our transition from preludes and postludes only, to the playing of a recorded hymn, to a live soloist during worship, we have been singing a new song...a song of blessing God's name; a song of salvation; a song declaring God's glory and marvelous works;

a song of loving and serving God and loving and serving our vulnerable neighbors, by refraining from adding our voices to the music.

This choice was not forced upon us by the Governor, the North Carolina Synod, or the National Church. Other churches responded differently, but the Council and I prayerfully discerned that for St. James, this was the most faithful response to the call to love our neighbors as ourselves.

It is in that same love that beginning August 1 we will sing (as a congregation) a hymn at the conclusion of worship. Masks are encouraged during singing, but not required. Those who are uncomfortable with live singing may leave after the final blessing and before the hymn.

We hope to continue this opportunity for singing and pray we are able gradually to return to a full service and more singing in the fall, but that will be contingent upon infection rates and further recommendations from the CDC, the Governor, and the Synod.

Thank you for your prayers and patience, and God's peace as we continue this journey together.


