James tells us to stop showing favoritism in the assembly, treating the rich visitor



with more honor than the poor one. Jesus himself seems to show partiality in his first response to the Syrophoenician woman in today's gospel. Was he testing her faith in saying Gentiles don't deserve the goods meant for God's children? Or was he speaking out of his human worldview, but transcended those limits when she took him by surprise with her reply? Either way, the story tells us that God shows no partiality. Everyone who brings a need to Jesus is received with equal honor as a child and heir.



### Yabim District, Evangelical Lutheran Church in Papua New Guinea (ELCPNG)

Papua New Guinea is a stunningly beautiful place with stunningly beautiful people! The North Carolina Synod is blessed to be in a companion relationship with the Yabim District, located in and around the city of Lae. The ELCPNG has 17 districts which are similar to ELCA synods. Each district is divided into circuits, like NC Synod conferences. Each

Eight was a magic number Mission Team 2018 from Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Hickory, just returned from eight days in Costa Rica building on their more than ten-year relationship with ILCO staff (Iglasia Luturana Costarricense) and reconnecting with members in three of its faith communities.

First, our group of eight walked and talked with members of La Carpio, a faith community outside of San José ministers that primarily to Nicaraguan immigrants. We played with, prayed with, and created memories for the children attending Casa abierta, the remaining daycare run by ILCO. As we exchanged hugs and giggles and captured their smiles in photos, we were reminded of Jesus's admonition that "whomever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child

#### Dear friends,

Just last night the remnants of Hurricane Ida barreled through the Northeast, leaving devastation in their wake. New York, Pennsylvania and New Jersey were hit with historic flash flooding and tornadoes touched down in Maryland and New Jersey. Homes and subways filled with water, and cars were swept away. The death toll is expected to rise, and authorities continue to work on restoring transportation services.

Meanwhile, information regarding the extent of the destruction in

Louisiana and parts of Mississippi continues to trickle in, and the damage will undoubtedly be more severe than we know today. In Louisiana, some evacuees have been told not to return because many areas remain without electricity and people are struggling to find gas, food and clean water. With power lines down and communication hindered, many are waiting for relief in dangerous 90-degree heat. Lutheran Disaster Response is developing plans to accompany onthe-ground partners, including social ministry organizations and synods, in the areas impacted. Immediate needs are expected to include food and shelter, while long-term recovery could include helping people repair or rebuild their damaged homes.
