For as long as I can remember, we have never received a phone call before our Mission Trip to let us know what kind of project we would be doing on an upcoming mission trip, this was a first. We received a call on the Thursday before we were to leave on Sunday, letting us know that we would be serving at the home of an elderly couple named David and Carol. There, we would be doing a little landscaping, trimming hedges, and building a wheelchair ramp for Mrs. Carol, as she experienced a stroke a short time back and was having difficulties walking. Due to the stroke, it appeared that a wheelchair was going to be part of their life in the near future. And then, these words followed, "but you have to get up their driveway first."

We were told that it was very steep and with a little head start and with us "Booking" it, we should be fine. The first three attempts at the driveway after arriving on Sunday was not successful.

7:00AM Breakfast time on Monday morning came quickly. We ate, packed up the van and off we go, heading for our worksite. We arrived at the steep gravel driveway. We pulled in, back up to the other side of the entrance road, all of the youth in the first van climbed into the very back of the van and held on tight. Off we go, heading up the driveway as fast as we could, the further we went, the slower the van moved and then, we came to the left turn in the driveway. The van came to a crawl while the youth in back were yelling encouragement, slowly, the van creeped around the curve, it finally caught traction and off we go for the remainder of the driveway. The second van followed the same route as the first and arrived safely at the top. Victory was sweet.

The work began on the new wheelchair ramp. The youth worked hard the entire week. They ran the weed eater down both sides of the driveway, trimmed hedges, and cut back limbs that were hanging over the drive, all the way back to the road. They repaired a set of back doorsteps with railings while we were there.

We worked from around 8:30 to 4:00 each day except for Thursday, we celebrated finishing the ramp around 5:30. While we were there, Mrs. Carol fell twice during the night, one of her falls was on Wednesday evening and re-



quired a hospital stay. AS she came home on Thursday, she was able to step onto her new ramp with a walker and made the first official use of her brand new ramp. What a sight it was, and the youth beamed with pride for a job well done.

Friday, would normally be our day off but our youth served that day since we were heading to the beach on Saturday for the extension of our trip. As usual, the youth worked hard around the camp cleaning out old storage rooms and taking what was not needed to the dump or to a secondhand store.

We were told that there was a movie being filmed on the campus where we were staying and several times at different locations around campus, we saw the crew working. But, we were so tired, all we could think about was getting a shower and eating supper. Then, a bonus night came when we saw them setting up a scene. We hung out a bit, watching them communicating back and forth like the secret service. The scene was set and, the lights were testing and all of a sudden, David R. White from the movie, God's Not Dead, appeared. He was extremely nice, came over and took several pictures with us as individuals and as a group. We are looking forward to seeing the movie come out in October.

As each day came to a close, we would pack up the tools and head back to camp for dinner, a quick shower and then to worship and small group time. We talked about meekness, reverence, sacrifice, trust and how all that fits into who we are as followers of Christ. What a wonderful time to serve, to grow and build to a relationship with God and each other. This year's summer was amazing.
