Join us after worship December 21 for cocoa, coffee and cookies in the Fellowship Hall as the children of St. James tell us the Christmas story.



This Week's Lesson...

Ezekiel's Responsibility - Ezekiel 33:7-16a

As we continue in the book of Ezekiel, we see his prophetic role continues. This time he will be called a "watchman" of the people of Isarael, who are now in exile. Ezekiel is to warn the people of the approaching consequences for their sinful behavior. Today's lesson says that the path of righteousness is to be followed even in the face of suffering; walking in the path of the wicked will

result in destruction.

There are opportunities for us to speak a watchman's words of warning and wisdom to those around us. God doesn't desire that anyone should perish. 
