

This Week's Lesson...

The Servant's Suffering – Isaiah 53:1-7

In today's lesson, we will discuss a very well-known Scripture passage from Isaiah. Isaiah faithfully preached these words of comfort to the Jews, but he would never experience what it meant or what would happen to fulfill these prophecies! Isaiah predicts how the Babylonian captivity will end but then goes on to describe how a more oppressive captivity would end: the captivity of sin! Glory to God that we live in a time when these prophecies have been fulfilled, and because of the servant's suffering, death, and resurrection, we worship Him in the highest!
